**Tomorrow, May 9 is the Final Day of Early Voting for Maryland's
Primary Presidential Election**
Friday, May 10 is Deadline to Request a Mail-In Ballot by Email
Primary Election Day is May 14

ANNAPOLIS (May 8, 2024) – The Maryland State Board of Elections (SBE) reminds voters that tomorrow, May 9, is the final day to vote early in the 2024 Primary Presidential Election and that requests for a mail-in ballot via email must be submitted online by 11:59 p.m. **Friday, May 10, 2024.**

Early voting is available tomorrow until 8 p.m. A complete list of early voting centers for the Primary Election is available [online](#) ([Spanish version](#)). Unregistered individuals can still register to vote and vote early at any early voting center in the county in which they reside.

“Early voting offers a convenient voting method for many Marylanders to cast their ballots and ensure their voices are heard,” said State Administrator Jared DeMarinis. “To date, we have seen more than 100,000 in-person early votes cast statewide and expect tomorrow’s turnout to be robust.”

While the deadline to receive a mail-in ballot by the U.S. Postal Service has passed, voters may still request a mail-in ballot be sent to them by email. Voters may submit a request for an email ballot [online \(English and Spanish\)](#). Requests must be **received** by May 10 at 11:59 p.m.

Voters who have received mail-in ballots – or who request a mail-in ballot be sent by email prior to this Friday’s deadline – may return the ballots via the U.S. Postal Service or by placing their ballot in a secure ballot box. Ballots returned by the U.S. Mail must be postmarked by May 14. Each of Maryland’s 286 ballot boxes are available for use until May 14 at 8 p.m. Voters can return their mail-in ballots using any official ballot box in their county of residence. Unregistered individuals wishing to register to vote and vote in person on Primary Election Day – May 14 – may do so at their polling place. They can find their polling place based upon their residence online ([English and Spanish](#)).

Please note that some polling place locations have been changed or added since the last election. Polls are open from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m. Voters who are in line by 8 p.m. will be able to cast their vote.
