

1. Announcements and Important Meetings

On June 10, the Maryland Cybersecurity Council met remotely. The meeting was primarily a presentation from Tom Wheeler and David Simpson on their Brookings Institute paper discussing the future of 5G cellular technology in the United States and, what new security approaches may be needed to protect federal, State, and local infrastructures. There was no other new business.

2. Voter Registration

MDVOTERS

User acceptance testing (UAT) continues for a July deployment. Approximately 80 plus issues will be incorporated. Development includes updates and enhancements to reports and exports across all facets of MDVOTERS, ERIC enhancements and a re-design of the electronic registration screens.

MVA Transactions

During May, MVA collected the following voter registration transactions:

Non-Citizens

All resources have been focused on election operation, no information is available at this time.

3. Candidacy and Campaign Finance (CCF) Division

Campaign Finance

Over 92% of the campaign finance reports have been filed for Presidential Pre-Primary 1 and 2 reports. Winners from the Primary election that filed late must pay their late fees by August 4, or their nominations will be vacated. The CCF Division has been in contact with those candidates.

June 1, 2020 was the filing deadline for Title 14 Business Contribution Disclosure Statements. 826 statements have been filed. This is nearly 100% of the registered entities in the system.

Enforcement

1. Committee to Elect Rain Pryor paid \$25.00 on April 29, 2020, for disbursement by unauthorized method- Cash greater than \$25.00.
2. Baltimore for David Warnock paid \$50.00 on May 05, 2020, for failure to record all contributions

Candidacy

The deadline to file a declaration of intent as a petition or non-principal political party candidate is July 6 at 5pm. We are equipped to handle remote filings.

4. Project Management Office (PMO)

Inventory Management

The FY2020 statewide Inventory Audit began on March 1, 2020. At this time, 66% of equipment and supplies have been inventory audited.

We received back at our warehouse the 75 ballot drop off boxes back after the election. We checked for any issues with each of the drop off boxes. We also learned about pinhole gaps between the metal plates at the top of the drop off boxes, and we filled those gaps.

FY2022 Pollbook Project

We continued planning related tasks for the project that included:

- Making additional updates to the project management documentation which is now being peer reviewed by SBE prior to the submission of the documentation to the Department of Information Technology (DoIT),
- Continued identifying requirements for the pollbook solution,
- Completing the interviews for ten contract project candidates for three positions. The individuals are expected to start sometime in July, and
- The continued work on other aspects of the project that include other project requirements and contingency plan development.

State of Maryland

June 2 Primary Election – Preliminary Review

Since the June 2 Primary Election is not yet finished, this is a preliminary report on the election. Much of the data we typically provide after an election cannot be provided until all of the local boards of elections have certified their elections and finished data entry and audits in MDVOTERS, the system from which most data is obtained.

In previous meetings, we shared with you the efforts we were taking to educate voters about the upcoming elections, how this election would be different, and how to vote by mail. Thanks to the efforts of our dedicated and diverse voter outreach team, voters understood there was an election, that it was a vote-by-mail election, and if they couldn't vote by mail, they knew where to go to vote in person.

We previously provided you with the 145-page report on the June 2 voter education effort but would like to share some of the highlights. The campaign was statewide and included TV, radio, digital, earned media, and grassroots and community-based efforts. In 3 weeks, there were over 84 million impressions, over 4 million views of videos, over ½ million clicks on the ads, and placed more than 225 articles and stories in media outlets around the State. Equally important are the organizations and coalitions - nearly 700 of them - that shared important information about this election. Approximately 20,000 flyers were distributed in Baltimore City through COVID-19 safe street teams, Black Girls Vote and food distribution sites partnering with Thread and Johns Hopkins.

There were specific efforts to reach minority voters. The voter outreach team included GreiBO – a Baltimore-based firm to assist with stakeholder outreach to the African American community statewide, including key influencer messaging, in-community events and social media for Baltimore City residents - and Cool & Associates – a team focused on stakeholder outreach to the Latinx community and Spanish-speaking earned media. These efforts were enhanced by Gilberto Zelaya of the Montgomery County Board of Elections, who was the face of the Spanish-speaking outreach efforts.

Turnout was impressive – almost 1.5 million voters participated in this election. It is clear that voters wanted to be heard. The statewide turnout was just over 41%. In the last 20 years, only the 2008 Primary Election had higher turnout. There were several counties where voter turnout exceeded the 2016 Primary Election. They were:

- Baltimore City - 48% turnout (3% increase)
- Charles, Kent and Prince George's Counties - 46% turnout (range of 1% to 9% increase)
- Cecil County - 41% turnout (7% increase)
- Montgomery County - 39% turnout (0.7% increase)
- Calvert County - 36.7% turnout (1% increase)

Most voters – 97% – voted and returned the ballot they received in the mail or electronically. The ballot drop off boxes were well used, and we are compiling data to show what percentage of ballots were returned by mail and returned at the ballot drop off boxes.

SBE sent emails to approximately 50,100 voters to download their ballot from SBE's website. Approximately, 32,932 of these voters logged into the online account. The table below shows the type of voter requesting an electronic ballot and how the voter chose to mark his or her ballot.

About 35,000 voters statewide voted in person at the 44 vote centers. 21 of the vote centers were open beyond 8 pm for voters who were in line at 8 pm.

This election brought a new way of voting for most voters and were conducted in unprecedented times. They also posed significant challenges for election officials, and there were areas where we could have done better. We have learned from this election and will make the necessary changes for the November election.

1. Mailhouse Vendor

We have previously shared our disappointment with the vendor. The issues were not limited to Baltimore City but the City issues were significant.

The vendor did not meet the mailing schedule for Baltimore City ballots. Ballots for Baltimore City voters were scheduled to be mailed on May 8, and the vendor never indicated that Baltimore City ballots would be delayed. On May 7, the vendor confirmed that ballots would be mailed on May 8, and on May 11, the vendor confirmed that ballots were mailed on May 8 and mailings would continue on May 11 and 12. On May 15, we learned that 60,000 ballots were mailed on May 14 and 30,000 ballots were mailed on May 15. Upon learning this, we immediately started working with the United States Postal Service and over the weekend, we developed a plan to get ballots into Maryland as quickly as possible.

Additionally, the vendor:

- Printed the wrong ballot for Baltimore City Council District 1.
- In Prince George’s County, 90,000 voters received only the Spanish version of the instructions and list of vote centers and ballot drop off boxes
- A court-ordered notice was not included in ballot packets for Hagerstown voters
- There were delays in the mailing schedule for Montgomery County ballots
- Ballots for South Carolina voters arrived on a USPS truck with ballots for Marylanders

As we look to November, we are evaluating all of our options. We are exploring our options under the current contract and are working with other ballot printers to get ballots to test and determine their capacity for November. We will build more vendor accountability into the contract and will expand our team to manage the contract and process. An election

with a significant number of ballots delivered by mail needs support similar to our in-person voting operation.

2. Removing City Results on Election Night

We acknowledge that removing City results from our website election night led to questions and concerns, and we should have been quicker in releasing statement explaining what happened.

We provided the vendor with a corrected ballot, but the vendor printed and mailed the wrong ballot. This meant that the voting system counted the votes for District 1 and judge of the circuit court wrong. When we saw that results for District 1 looked wrong, we didn't know what the problem was and how many contests were affected. Out of an abundance of caution, we removed all City results.

Again, we should have been quicker to tell people why the results were removed and we'll put a process in place in case we need to remove results in the future

3. Long lines on Election Day

In response to the public health emergency, there were a limited number of vote centers. The State Board added two additional vote centers in Baltimore City, and ten more ballot drop off locations were added in Baltimore City.

4. Voters whose ballots were returned by the USPS as “undeliverable ballots” were marked as having “voted”

About 1,200 voters statewide were required to vote a provisional ballot on election day. Almost 800 of these voters would have had to vote a provisional ballot anyway because they had a new address or wanted to change party affiliation. Provisional ballots cast by voters who provided a new address were counted.

This issue arose as a result of moving to a vote by mail election. When voters requested a ballot by mail, they provided the address where they wanted the ballot to be mailed. This meant that few absentee ballots were returned as undeliverable. In future elections, we will not code these voters as “already voted” so if they show up to vote in person, they can cast a ballot if they haven't moved or vote a provisional ballot if they have

5. Voters in City Council District 12 received a ballot with District 14 contest

When a new apartment building was built, the building's address was placed in the wrong City council district. This meant that 104 voters in one apartment building were assigned to the wrong City Council District, but only 82 of these voters were eligible for the June 2 election (22 voters were unaffiliated voters). Once the Baltimore City Board of Elections learned of the issue, they immediately notified voters, delivered corrected ballots to some voters, and instructed others that they could vote a provisional ballot that included District 14.

Because this occasionally happens, we are moving away from the manual process of manually assigning streets to districts to a more automated GIS process. This should reduce the likelihood of this type of error.

6. Changing the Date Printed on the Ballots

When the special general election and the presidential/City primary election were split, the ballots had already been programmed and printed and ballots had been mailed. We discussed various options and decided that using ballots with “April 28, 2020” had the least risk to the election as long as we let voters know that there was no impact to their ballots being counted.

To reduce any confusion about “April 28, 2020” being printed on the ballot, we included information about it in the instructions every voter received and this was a key message in the voter education campaign. I hesitate to say that this will not likely happen again but if it does, we will consider all options, decide what option is least risky, and educate voters if it’s needed. We later learned that other states made the same decision when their elections were postponed

After every election, there is significant work done to verify the accuracy and integrity of the election. This work is already underway.

Phase 1 of the automated ballot tabulation audit of ballot images is mostly completed, and Phase 2 is well underway. Phase 1 includes all ballots counted during canvassing prior to and up to election day as well as all ballots cast on election day in vote centers. Before certifying election results, each local board received four Phase 1 reports comparing the voting system’s results against the results from the independent tabulation performed by the automated audit software.

These reports showed that:

1. The voting system and Clear Ballot tabulated the same number of ballots (cards cast).
2. Any differences between the two systems’ results were less than 0.5%.
3. The voting system accurately tabulated the results

Phase 2 of the audit is underway. After the completion of the canvasses and prior to the State Board of Canvassers’ certification of the election results, all ballot images are retabulated, and a second set of reports are issued. Like Phase 1, these reports should confirm that the voting system accurately tabulated the ballot images from all canvasses. The Phase 1 comparison reports and automated audit results (generated before we provided the voting system’s results) are posted on SBE’s website, and Phase 2 reports will be posted as we receive them.

We have also started our post-election comprehensive audit of critical parts of the election. The Voting System Division reviews data associated with the pre-election logic and accuracy testing, opening times of the election day vote centers, reviewing discrepancies between the number of voters checked in to vote and the number of ballots cast, and performs the voting system verification. Erin Perrone and Cortnee Bryant collect and review various documentation from the local boards to complete other auditing tasks, including the ballot accounting forms. An audit is also performed on absentee and provisional ballots from each local board and the canvassing minutes.

Although voter registration reopened on June 15, we need to “close” the election in MDVOTERS. This “closing” enables us to obtain important data and allows the local boards to start processing new voter registrations and changes to existing registration.

We have also participated in two post-election briefings.

On June 11, Nikki Charlson participated on a webinar hosted by Baltimore Votes! to discuss the June 2 election. Baltimore Votes! is a coalition of Baltimore-based organizations including the League of Women Voters on Baltimore City, Black Girls Vote, Open Society Institute, Out for Justice, and other organizations. Nikki participated in the coalition's pre-election webinars and shared information about changes to the June 2 election and was asked to share thoughts after the election. She reviewed preliminary turnout information and challenges from the June 2 election. Other participants explained the roles of the State Board of Elections and staff, the local boards of elections and staff, and pollworkers and the coalition's lists of problems with this election.

On June 16, we participated in a joint briefing hosted by the Senate's Education, Health and Environmental Affairs Committee and the House's Ways and Means Committee. The committees requested information on list maintenance, the mailing process and relationship with our vendor, outreach to "inactive" voters and votes whose ballots were returned as undeliverable, how the number of vote centers were determined, and collaboration with the local boards of elections. In addition to providing this information, we also provided a timeline of the changes leading up to June 2 and identified corrective actions we will take before the November election.

ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL'S REPORT

June 18, 2020

1. *Fusaro v. Davitt et al.*, No: 1:17-cv-03582 (U.S. District Court, D. Md.). No changes from the last update. Plaintiff Dennis Fusaro brought a complaint in federal court alleging that Maryland violates the First and Fourteenth Amendments by limiting access to the voter list to Maryland voters and only for purposes related to the electoral process. On September 4, 2018, the State defendants' motion to dismiss the complaint was granted, and the plaintiff appealed. On July 12, 2019, the Fourth Circuit vacated the dismissal order, and remanded the case for further proceedings. The parties have since conducted discovery and briefed dispositive summary judgment motions, and are awaiting a ruling from the Court.

2. *Johnson v. Prince George's County Board of Elections*, No. CAL16-42799 (Cir. Ct. Prince Georges Cnty.). No change from the last update. This case involves a challenge under the U.S. Constitution and Maryland Constitution and Declaration of Rights to the SBE's alleged failure to provide information and access to voter registration and voting resources to eligible voters detained by the Prince Georges County Department of Correction during the 2016 election. The case had been originally filed in the Circuit Court for Prince Georges County but was removed on the basis of the federal claims asserted by the Plaintiffs. On February 27, 2018, the U.S. District Court for the District of Maryland granted SBE's motion to dismiss the Plaintiffs' federal claims, declined to exercise jurisdiction over the state claims, and remanded the case to the Circuit Court for further proceedings. The parties are awaiting further direction from the court.

3. *Judicial Watch v. Lamone*, No. 1:17-cv-02006-ELH (U.S. District Court, D. Md.). This case involves the denial of access to Maryland's voter registration database. Under Maryland law, access to the voter registration list is limited to Maryland registered voters and only for non-commercial, election-related uses. Judicial Watch—an elections watchdog group located in Tennessee—requested Maryland's voter registration “database” and was denied because it was not a Maryland registered voter. Judicial Watch filed suit, arguing that the database was required to be disclosed under the federal National Voter Registration Act. On April 24, 2019, Judicial Watch filed a reply in support of its motion for summary judgment. On May 8, 2019, the defendants filed a reply in support of their cross-motion for summary judgment. An August 8, 2019, the District Court awarded summary judgment to the plaintiffs, but requested further briefing on the issue of whether the State Board of Elections should be compelled to produce the

dates of birth of voters along with the other voter information available on Maryland's voter registration lists. On April 17, 2020, the District Court ruled that dates of birth must be included in the list provided to plaintiffs. The parties have reached an agreement-in-principle as to resolving the remaining issues in the case, and on May 27, 2020 the District Court dismissed the claims in the case without prejudice pending consummation of the parties' agreement.

4. *National Federation of the Blind, Inc., et al. v. Lamone et al.*, No. 1:19-CV-02228-ELH (U.S. District Court, D. Md.). On August 1, 2019, the National Federation of the Blind ("NFB"), NFB's Maryland chapter, and three individual plaintiffs filed a lawsuit against the State Administrator and the individual members of the State Board of Elections alleging that SBE's BMD policy has, in practice, violated the rights of voters with disabilities "to an equal opportunity vote in person by a secret ballot," in violation of Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act. Plaintiffs seek an order requiring the State Board "in all future elections to offer BMDs to every in-person voter as the default method of voting, with paper ballots offered only to those voters who affirmatively opt out of using the BMD or in cases where there are long lines of people waiting to vote." On September 3, 2019, defendants filed a motion to dismiss the complaint, and on September 20, 2019, plaintiffs filed a motion for a preliminary injunction, seeking relief in time for the November 2020 election. On February 10, 2020, the court denied the defendants' motion to dismiss, and denied the plaintiffs' motion for preliminary injunction. On February 24, 2020, the Court entered a scheduling order governing the discovery period for the case, and on June 11, 2020, the Court modified that scheduling order following a joint motion by the parties. Discovery is now scheduled to close on November 9, 2020, and dispositive motions are due November 30, 2020.

5. *Hewes v. Alabama Sec'y of State et al.*, No. 1:19-cv-09158-JMF (U.S. District Court, S.D.N.Y.). No change from the last update. On October 3, 2019, plaintiff Henry F. Hewes, a putative candidate for the Democratic nomination for President for the 2020 election, sued the unnamed Secretaries of State of 43 states, (including Maryland), alleging that state-imposed limitations on ballot access for federal presidential candidates violate the First and Fourteenth Amendments to the U.S. Constitution. Plaintiff seeks an order compelling the defendants to place the name of the plaintiff and any other candidate who has registered with the Federal Election Commission on the primary ballots of the states named as defendants. The Defendants jointly filed a motion to dismiss asserting common arguments for dismissal on December 19, 2019. On January 23, 2020, the plaintiff filed an amended complaint, and the defendants thereafter renewed their joint

motion to dismiss. The plaintiff's opposition to the motion to dismiss was due May 8, 2020, but the plaintiff has not served an opposition, nor does the docket reflect that an opposition was filed.

6. *Public Interest Legal Foundation, Inc. v. Lamone*, No. 1:19-cv-03564-ELH (D. Md.). Plaintiff Public Interest Legal Foundation, Inc., filed a lawsuit against the State Administrator, the members of the State Board, and Erin Dennis, seeking access to Maryland's list of registered voters pursuant to the public inspection provisions of the National Voter Registration Act. Plaintiff alleges that the District Court's published decision in *Judicial Watch, supra*, entitles them to access, and that the issue left outstanding by the court in that case does not implicate their request since they are not seeking individuals' dates of birth as part of the information provided for each voter on the list. Plaintiffs filed a motion for summary judgment simultaneously with their complaint. On January 17, 2020, defendants answered the Complaint. On January 24, 2020, defendants moved for a stay of the proceedings pending the resolution of the *Judicial Watch* matter and any appeals therefrom, due to the similarity of the issues between the cases. The parties have now agreed to resolve the case on terms similar to the resolution of the *Judicial Watch* matter.

7. *Chong Su Yi v. Hogan*, Nos. 480720, 480721, 480722, 480723 (Cir. Ct. Montgomery Cty.). On March 6, 2020, plaintiff Chong Su Yi filed four apparently identical complaints in the Circuit Court for Montgomery County challenging the results of Maryland's 2018 elections, and naming Governor Larry Hogan as defendant. Specifically, Mr. Chong appears to be arguing that the results are invalid because of the use of religious facilities as polling places, that the State's use of "scanners" to tabulate ballots is unconstitutional and/or not permitted by federal law, and that the State's identification of candidates' party affiliations on the general election ballot is not permitted by State law. The complaints are substantially identical to complaints Mr. Chong filed in 2019, which the court dismissed with prejudice earlier this year. Defendant moved to dismiss the complaints on May 3, 2020. On May 15, 2020, Mr. Chong filed substantially identical amended complaints in these actions. On June 1 Defendants moved to dismiss those amended complaints as well. On June 7, 2020, plaintiff filed yet another round of substantially identical amended complaints, but this time adding the State of Maryland as a Defendant in addition to Governor Hogan. Defendants' response to these amended complaints is due June 22, 2020.

8. *Maryland Green Party, et al. v. Hogan et al.*, No. 1:20-CV-01253-ELH (U.S. District Ct., D. Md.). On May 19, 2020, the Maryland Green Party, its Chairman Steven Ellis, the Libertarian Party of Maryland, and its Chairman Robert S. Johnston, III,

filed a lawsuit in federal court against Governor Hogan and State Administrator Lamone seeking relief from Maryland's statutory 10,000-signature petition requirement for new party petitions, and from Maryland's statutory signature verification standard for validating and counting petition signatures. The Maryland Green Party is also seeking damages. Plaintiffs claim that the 10,000-signature requirement and the signature verification standard, as applied in the COVID-19 environment, violate their First and Fourteenth Amendment rights to obtain access to the ballot as non-principal parties. Plaintiffs seek a reduction in the signature amount required for new party petitions to 1,000, and a requirement that the State Board accept any signature on the petitions that the State Board can match to an actual Maryland voter, notwithstanding any technical non-compliance with the signature standard. Simultaneous with their complaint, plaintiffs filed a motion for preliminary injunction. On June 8, 2020, Peter James – who is seeking an unaffiliated nomination for election to the U.S. House of Representatives representing the Sixth Congressional District – filed a motion to intervene in the case. Plaintiffs and Defendants have since agreed to a resolution in principle of the plaintiffs' complaint, and the hearing that had been scheduled for June 12, 2020 was canceled by the Court.

9. *The Committee for the Baltimore Regional Transportation Authority Mandate, Inc., et al. v. Lawrence J. Hogan, Jr., et al.*, (State Bd. of Elections June 15, 2020). On June 15, 2020, the Committee for the Baltimore Regional Transportation Authority Mandate, Inc., and Samuel Jordan, filed an Administrative Complaint with the State Board of Elections against Governor Hogan, State Administrator Linda H. Lamone, and the State Board of Elections, alleging that the 10,000-signature requirement established by Article XI-A of the Maryland Constitution for petitions seeking to place a proposed amendment to the Baltimore City Charter was impermissibly high in light of the restrictions imposed by the COVID-19 pandemic. The complaint also alleges that the lack of access to the internet by numerous Baltimore City residents renders the State Board's promulgation of SBE Policy 2020-01, which allows the use of electronic signatures on petitions, ineffective for Baltimore City petitions. Complainants seek a reduction in the constitutional signature amount to 500 signatures, and the establishment of at least two in-person sites in Baltimore City to permit voters to complete and sign petitions in support of the proposed charter amendment. The complainants have also requested expedited consideration of their complaint.

I am taking this opportunity to inform the State Board of elections of concerns and observations I have with the mail in voting we all just experienced. I hope the board of elections will take these concerns to heart and move forward with in-person voting in November.

- The return envelopes for the ballots had private information on the back where the required signature was located. The voter's name, voter identification number and party affiliation were listed right there. Dropping that information into a postal box, which is NOT secure and requires that ballot to be handled by many hands before it reaches the board of elections office, is an invitation to election fraud. It is well known that bins of undelivered ballots have been "found" well after an election has been certified.
- The ballots mailed out were sent to everyone on the voter rolls registered Democrat or Republican. Obviously the voter rolls have not been cleaned up since a friend who has lived in Florida for three years - and is registered in Florida to vote - received a ballot at his address in Florida. Duane Keenan is his name.
- Another friend who is legally a resident of Florida - and registered to vote there - received a ballot at his home in Maryland.
- In Anne Arundel County the surveillance cameras were not placed and set up until a week after the drop boxes were placed at the 4 libraries.
- On Primary day, I was at Severna Park Library most of the day. There was a fair amount of confusion among voters about the ballots. I attribute that to lack of communication from the BOE to the voters to ensure ballots were returned appropriately and accurately. People drove into the parking lot, parked and then attempted to hand deliver their completed ballots into the library.
- On Primary Day, there were traffic jams in the parking lots with people trying to drop off their ballots and park to vote in person. Thank goodness there were those of us electioneering in the parking lot to assist the confused, because the election judges were not. Two of them stood outside the library door entrance all day.
- Some voters came to the library to vote in person because they had not received a ballot in the mail.

These are just a few of the many problems I have heard occurred.

Dear Administrators and Board Members of the State Board of Elections:

Since 2004, the ACLU of Maryland's Election Protection campaign has been working across the state and in communication with the Maryland State Board of Elections (SBE) to ensure every Marylander can exercise their fundamental right to vote. Undoubtedly, the recent elections in the midst of a pandemic required the most unprecedented and comprehensive changes to our election systems we have ever seen.

While this letter is intended to outline our organization's concerns and recommendations following the Primary election based mostly on undisputed problems, we want to applaud the State Board of Elections' swift decision and execution of a primarily "vote by mail" system during a pandemic that has a disproportionate impact on people of color, people with low income, people with disabilities, and all people considered at risk of complications due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Despite the concerns expressed below, the Board's attempt to provide every registered voter with a ballot by mail helped to make it possible for the vast majority of registered voters to exercise their right to vote safely from home. If this had not been an option, we cannot even fathom how many people would have been disenfranchised, what the polling sites would have looked like, nor what the absentee voting process would have entailed. As such, any attempts to use this letter to argue against mailing registered voters their ballots in November would be a gross distortion of our report, analysis, and recommendations.

And, although we are pleased about the high turnout in the Primary (made possible by ballots mailed to every registered voter), we must not allow that to be an excuse for ignoring the problems, barriers and disparities that have emerged or persisted.



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The issues and concerns we have can be summarized in five main categories: 1) negligent or inadequate planning; 2) human error; 3) disenfranchisement of people in jails; 4) insufficient transparency and communication, and 5) lack of accountability. These issues came to our attention through various public sources, coalition partners, and our Election Protection Hotline, which received numerous calls in advance of the June 2 Primary. While the examples detailed in this letter originate from the 2020 Maryland Primary, these categories of concern are far from new. It should be no surprise to Maryland State Board of Election staff that the ACLU is concerned about technological “glitches”, process issues, poor planning that leads to long lines in polling places, mistakes that lead to confusion or voter disenfranchisement, and the overall disproportionate impact these issues have on Black voters, in particular.

We refuse to let another election cycle go by without speaking loudly and clearly about what Maryland voters and our democracy deserve: a well-resourced election system run by proactive, engaged elections administrators, governed by board members passionate about voting rights and with an understanding of the myriad barriers to voting that exist for some people, and a transparent process that promises clarity, equity, and accountability.

Core Recommendations

Investigate the cause of all technological glitches and mistakes, including all those detailed below, ensure results are transparent, and hold those responsible accountable for their mistakes. Without a clear understanding of what went wrong, how, and why, we cannot be certain the same problems will not persist or similar problems will not occur in the General election.

Establish a community task force to ensure the safety and integrity of our election. Bringing together a diverse range of stakeholders can alert elections administrators to concerns and considerations earlier and engage resources and support from community and advocacy partners. Community engagement creates buy-in from the outset and provides those with concerns access to information as well as avenues to address concerns.



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Produce a comprehensive, fully-funded plan with layers of oversight, audits, emergency/contingency planning, logistics, and outreach for the November election. Present the plan in advance to the public, and take community/stakeholder input. Planning for a General election during a pandemic is no easy feat. We know there will be challenges, so we must anticipate and plan to create a smooth, safe, accessible, and equitable election.

Address voter disenfranchisement of people in jails by providing voter registration forms, absentee ballot applications, and ballots with pre-paid postage to all jails and detention centers where eligible voters are held. These materials should be delivered with enough time to allow jail staff and eligible voters to learn and follow the steps (understanding the many barriers that may exist for prisoners.) While it has never been acceptable that people in jails rely entirely on outside volunteers and organizations who help with voter registration in some facilities, the COVID pandemic has left thousands of people who are eligible to vote with virtually no way to access their constitutionally protected right to vote. Now, more than ever, the responsibility lies fully with State Board of Elections to remove the barriers to voting for people in jails and ensure that eligible voters in jails have full and equal access to voting.

Specific Concerns and Recommendations

→ NEGLIGENT OR INADEQUATE PLANNING

Problems:

Our Primary elections suffered from a scarcity of in-person locations and no in-person early voting locations. Pervasive long lines throughout the day – but almost only in counties with high numbers of Black and Brown voters – even caused traffic jams, and inevitably, resulted in disenfranchisement. Long lines disproportionately disenfranchise people with disabilities and people with low income and others who cannot stand in line for two hours. Short lines and quick turnover at each voting location are necessary to ensure that individuals who need or want to vote in person can do so. Election year after election year, we see long lines in certain areas, areas where the polling places also run out of ballots and have glitches, even though advocacy organizations raise these



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concerns before the election and the administrators claimed to have it covered. Our elections deserve logistics experts and dedicated contingency planners to identify needs before they become problems and to resolve issues immediately.

Recommendations:

- Produce a comprehensive, fully-funded plan with layers of oversight, audits, emergency/contingency planning, logistics, and comprehensive voter outreach for the November election. Present the plan to the public and take community/stakeholder input.
- Provide all of the available options for voting: Vote by mail, drop boxes, online ballot delivery, in person early voting, same day registration, in-person voting, and provisional voting.
- Invest in robust, strategic logistics and planning such as cutting-edge, forward-thinking logistics, and communications, as well as appropriate IT staff and infrastructure to support the election.
- Plan for high turnout. Plan for unprecedented turnout in areas that all-too-often experience long lines and other issues.
- Develop robust contingency and emergency plans for possible problems.
- Create an Election Day logistics team to be dispatched to polls with growing lines to quickly identify and resolve needs, such as bottleneck at the polling location and other day-of issues.
- Develop a new recruitment and compensation plan for election judges. Improve education, training, handbooks, and support for poll workers.
- Have surplus machines, ballots, and election workers throughout the state available for quick delivery.
- Find solutions for slow-loading electronic poll books.
- Consider solutions for people who have their mail forwarded.
- Consider options for prepaid postage for online ballots.
- Provide signage and redirection at any polls that are not open.
- Create guidelines for police presence to ensure voters are safe (adequate amount of police presence for traffic and parking support, but not so much police presence that it creates an intimidating environment for voters).

→ HUMAN ERROR

Problems:

During the Primary election, the numerous errors made by State Board of Elections staff and vendors caused major delays and confusion in the timing,



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delivery, and information provided on the ballots to the public. Egregious mistakes by vendors and the State Board of Elections such as mailing ballots late, claims that ballots had been mailed when they had not, failure to make ballot corrections before mailing, and delays in sending information to vendors, caused public confusion about the timing for receipt of ballots. Moreover, inaccuracies on ballots were not corrected, including the date of Primary (explained as not having enough time to change) and District 1 title line, which caused further confusion about the accuracy and validity of the information on the ballots. Further, approximately 90,000 Prince George's voters were inadvertently sent instructions in Spanish only, the wrong ballots were sent to Remington Row in Baltimore City, and an e-poll book problem caused voters with "undeliverable" ballots to be marked as having already voted even when they had not in fact voted. Such blatant errors are unacceptable and must be investigated and addressed to prevent recurrence during the November election.

Recommendations:

- Develop a robust, dynamic, and constant auditing/testing system to identify glitches and errors in all aspects of our election system (to include SBE, local Boards, vendors, USPS, etc.), closely monitor lists and systems, ensure timely ballot delivery, and track voter experience.
- Invest in technology solutions that reduce opportunity for human error and ultimately save staff time.
- Build in staff and board member accountability measures.

→ INSUFFICIENT TRANSPARENCY AND COMMUNICATION

Problems:

A lack of transparency and communication with the public caused widespread confusion when major changes were made to the voting process. On the night after the Election, the Maryland State Board of Elections failed to communicate complete and timely information and explanations to the public about why the results had been removed from the website, which fostered confusion and mistrust in the election.

Moreover, the Maryland State Board of Elections has been inconsistent in the collection and sharing of data and numbers needed to fully understand and resolve problems. For example, the Maryland State Board of Elections says they cannot produce numbers for how many ballots arrived to voters from the vendor



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after Election Day, as they are lumped in with numbers of “undeliverable” ballots. It is critically important that we are able to separate out these numbers, as the causes, responsible parties, and reasonableness are vastly different between the number that arrived to the voter late and the number returned as “undeliverable.”

Finally, the Maryland State Board of Elections’ virtual meetings do not allow for public participation, comments, or open forum questions. Trust, transparency, and accountability require dialog. The “listen only” format sends a message to the public that their input and concerns are not valued, and keeps the Board from hearing from impacted voters and other stakeholders, who may have information and experiences that the Board could learn from.

Recommendations:

- Provide complete information, data, and explanations quickly and in language that is easy to understand.
- Collect, analyze, and provide complete, severable, and timely data.
- Invest in clear and consistent voter education and outreach that includes a clear, dedicated, measurable plan to reach Black and Brown voters.
- Improve the State Board of Elections’ website to avoid confusion, make processes simpler, and provide more and timely information to voters about the status of their ballot.
- Consolidate deadlines and clearly convey them to the public.
- Move State Board of Elections meetings to Facebook Live, WebEx, or Zoom so the public can participate.
- Consider a text alert system for major changes, including utilizing other texting systems maintained by public entities like schools.

→ LACK OF ACCOUNTABILITY

Problems:

Staff and vendors have not been held accountable for errors that disenfranchised voters during this process. No apologies have been made, no administrators or officials have been corrected, disciplined, or lost their jobs, no vendors have lost their contracts, and no board members have been removed.

Recommendations:



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- Investigate the cause of all glitches and mistakes, including all listed in this letter. Ensure the results of the investigation are made publicly available, and hold those responsible accountable.
- Establish a community task force that includes representation from community-based and Black-led organizations, people with disabilities, people with low income, people needing language assistance, and advocacy organizations with elections and voting rights experience
- Build in staff and board member accountability measures.

We fully understand that there is a lot to do in a short amount of time, and that 2020 has brought unprecedented and unforeseen challenges to many segments of our government and society. Now more than ever, given the crises we face, we must invest fully in the bedrock of our democracy and steadfastly safeguard the rights of the most marginalized. With proper investment and staffing, and the establishment of a community task force, we can ensure that November's elections are robust, safe, accessible, and equitable.

We look forward to our continued partnership and appreciate your consideration and action on these important recommendations.

Dear Chairman Cogan:

We, the undersigned of this letter representing over four hundred Maryland members of the National Council of Jewish Women, in agreement with Lt. Governor Rutherford concerns expressed at the June 3 Board of Public Works meeting, write to request that specific measures be taken so that the general elections this coming November can avoid the problems encountered during the recent June 2 primary. Those problems resulted in far fewer voters than in the 2016 primary, and long crowded lines that endangered public health.

We almost surely will still be dealing with the need to control Covid-19 contagion this coming November. Therefore, we ask the Board of Elections to start planning now for an election in which the majority of votes will be mail-in votes. To ensure that as many voters as possible are fully enfranchised we request the following three measures:

1. **Develop a marketing campaign and simplified ballots that will result in the maximum number of voters.** To accomplish this we suggest:
 - o The Board hire a commercial marketing company to design a marketing plan and invest in professionally produced TV and radio ads, with special outreach to minority communities and media.
 - o The Board task a marketing company to design a sampled, understandable ballot and encircle the signature panel on the envelope in bright orange as is done in some other states.
2. **Hire an in-state company to produce and mail ballots to allow for better coordination with the Board of Elections.**
3. **Ensure that there are enough polling places to enable social distancing and avoid long waits for election day in-person voting.**

Fully enfranchising every voter and protecting public health should be basic concerns of any democracy. We ask the State of Maryland to fulfill these missions

- LBE staff were able to address voter questions and concerns with confidence.

For all these reasons, we highly support conducting the Presidential General Election by mail in November.

We have compiled information from Maryland voters and their experience voting in the June 2nd Presidential Primary. We hope you will take their experiences as well as the summary of information provided by nonpartisan election protection volunteers into consideration as you prepare for your briefing with the Maryland State Board of Elections. Thank you.

Information from Monitoring Voter Centers

This information was submitted by close to 100 volunteers who helped with our nonpartisan election protection efforts on Election Day. Collectively, they helped to monitor a total of 44 vote centers in 16 counties. The information they provided has been summarized for easy review but captures most of the issues that were reported on June 2nd.

- **Drop Box Issues:** Poor placement of drop boxes seemed to be the biggest issue on Election Day. Meadowbrook drop box in Howard County for example was placed on a street corner. Voters driving on one side of the street missed the box completely because there was no signage and could only see the back of box which has no wrapper. A few voters reported thinking it was a “porta potty.” Voters who did see the box expressed frustration about having to step out of the car in the street to drop off the ballot. Volunteers witnessed accidents almost happen on numerous occasions at this location as voters tried to make U-turns to get to drop box. Other issues with placement include drop box being in the middle of parking lot with heavy traffic and no parking available. Voters who went to these locations in Prince George’s County for example could not get to box by 8pm. There were also reports of drop boxes being full and ballots having to be collected from voters at their cars – a concern for voters who were unsure whether or not the individuals collecting ballots worked for local board.
- **Accessibility Issues:** There were reports of ADA parking not being made available for voters in jurisdictions like Howard County and Prince George’s County. Election protection volunteers did manage to get judges to later reserve a few parking spots. There were a few locations, specifically in Baltimore City and Prince George’s County, that had no ramp for exiting the vote center. Volunteers witnessed voter in wheelchair and a few others with canes experiencing trouble leaving centers or having to wait altogether until these issues were later addressed. As locations grew busier and lines longer, there was no staff at many of these locations helping to move these voters to the front of the line. Also, no clear signage instructing these voters on how to get assistance if needed.
- **Electioneering Issues:** There was an overwhelming number of complaints about candidates and their campaign staff or volunteers at vote centers with no masks with no visible hand sanitizer to use regularly while handing out materials. We also received complaints that the 100 feet regulation being constantly violated – many stating that there was no visible marking for the distance requirement. Locations with clear marking still saw repeated violations., many of them getting close to voters without any PPE. We also received many

complaints about those electioneering using up parking spots closest to the entrances. Also, many continuing to keep their cars there when parking became an issue for voters arriving at these locations.

- **Lines (Cars and Voters):** Voters unable to social distance as lines grew long in Prince George's County, Silver Spring, Baltimore City, and Charles County. While those in line by 8pm were able to vote, many of these locations had lines of cars that were turned away at 8pm. Example: Bowie Gymnasium had a long line of cars waiting to get into the parking lot. Many in their cars for close to an hour. Some tried to abandon cars in order to run and drop off their ballot. Many tried to park at a nearby mall to vote. We witnessed people running across the street with ballots only to find the drop box had been locked. In some instances, the police blocked the entrance to get in line to vote. Other locations like Mt. Pleasant let voters drop off and get in line after 8pm. Well past 8pm, at certain locations, voters at the end of the line were not given a ticket to mark the end of line.
- **Feedback from voters while in line:** While most volunteers monitored from their cars, some did communicate with voters from a safe distance. Voters were not aware they had to vote at a center in their jurisdiction – many trying to leave and rush to a center near their home. Some reported going to their precinct location and having to search at the last minute to find information on where voter centers were located. Others reported never receiving a ballot in the mail. A few tried to get electronic ballots that day but were unable to get through to the local board.

Quotes from a few election protection volunteers:

There is so much work to do before November!!!! Broke my heart to see people, lots of people, clutching their unvoted ballots because the voting traffic (an hour-long traffic jam!!) kept them from getting to the polls in time... The image that sticks with me is of an older man who was the first person to be cut off by the police after waiting in traffic for more than an hour. He just flicked his ballot at his windshield and drove off, his face set in frustration. Killed me to see that. – Suzanna Banwell, College Park Community Center

There was a ramp but to exit there were 12 steep steps. I didn't see any accommodations for handicapped like a place to sit so they didn't have to stand for 45 minutes. -Susan Cochran, North County Library Glen Burnie

Drop box is on the other side of a large building. Voters can drive to the drop box, but it is not visible from the voting center accessible by a different entrance from the street. There is no sign from the Vote Center to the drop box. -Jeanne Jahl, Pip Moyer Recreation Center

Guy pictured with yellow bags was picking up ballots from cars. He said that the secure box was full which was not confirmed by the officials near the secure box because they were still collecting ballots. Other election officials did not know about this activity. One said it was done because of traffic. One said that all of the mail ballots collected in the bag would be PROVISIONAL. In any case when police re-routed traffic voters had to walk a long way to deposit their ballot in the secure box. -James Blasiak, Germantown Community Recreation Center

Information from MD voters who called 866-OUR-VOTE

866 Our Vote is a nonpartisan Election Protection coalition that works year-round to ensure that all voters have an equal opportunity to vote and have that vote count. For the Maryland Presidential Primary, a team of volunteer legal professionals covered calls coming from MD voters. They worked with Common Cause Maryland to ensure these voters received assistance with voting on or by Election Day. We have included a few examples from the call received below.

Voter Center Location Issues

- Essex voter was trying to locate polling place. The call center volunteer provided the voter with their polling place address. The caller was frustrated at how far the polling place was and the cost in gas it would take to get there.^[1]
- District Heights Caller called to determine the best polling center. Voter was disappointed that the voting centers were so far from her residence. Call center volunteer called the BOE to determine if any additional centers were opened and confirmed the closest one is the Kentland Community Center.^[2]

Residency/Election Day Location Issues

- The caller, a Towson voter, said that her son is in college; he is staying in Towson, MD, but lives up in PA. His current official residence is in PA, but the caller was trying to get him to register to vote in MD.^[3]
- Voter lives in MD, but is sheltering in place in Chicago. Has not asked for absentee ballot, and is not yet registered. Wanted to know if there was anything she could do for the primary. I told her too late. She should register as soon as she can and request absentee ballot.^[4]

Health issues

- Baltimore County voter was trying to figure out mail-in ballot. Voter is immuno-compromised and requested mail-in ballot but has not received it. Also didn't receive automatic mail-in ballot. Considered electronic delivery of ballot so she can still vote. The voter's neighbor is willing to print agent form for her, or willing to pick up from BoE for her. Wants to print Designation of Agent Form, which the Election Protection volunteer provided. Trying to locate BoE in Baltimore County. Mail issues in Baltimore.^[5]
- The caller had intended to vote in person for the election on 6/2. However, she was recently exposed to coronavirus. The voter is self-quarantining, so she wanted to receive further information on whether there was a way for her vote to be counted. The Election Protection volunteer instructed her to contact the local Board of Elections in Maryland and provided the contact details. Election Protection team called voter back and relayed understanding from another voter that there was a 2pm deadline for designated pickup. It was clear that she was at peace with this reality and would wait for the general.^[6]

Ballot Issues

- A Fort Washington voter called to report that they didn't get their absentee ballot (she mailed a request a few weeks prior to 6/2). The Election Protection volunteer checked the MD ballot request system and it had no status for her. She has health issues and does not want to go out because of COVID.^[7]

We had already filled out the ballots and planned to put them in the drop box. But since there was no parking, I was able to let him out to put the ballots in the box while I remained in the car.
Kent County	Yes	The dropbox was not easily visible when you drove up to the center to vote. The backside that did not have any signage indicating that it was a dropbox faced the road as you drove in, so you could not tell easily where to go. The boxes should be covered from all sides and there should be more signage indicating where the boxes are.

Allegany County	No	Walmart and Lowes and other such stores were open and yet the narrative was pushed that we couldn't vote safely. Hogwash!!!!!!! Every voter that received a mail in ballot and didn't go to an in person site was disenfranchised. No more mail in ballots in a broad sense. Sad!!!!!!
Howard County	Yes	Neither my husband nor myself received ballot in mail for the special election to fill out the term of Elijah Cummings. After several phone calls and trying to do this online, I went to the Ho.Co. Board of Elections office to pick up our ballots. We did fill them out and drop at the ballot box outside of the office. For the June 2 primary election, I received a ballot but my husband did not. It took a number of phones calls and time spent on the Maryland state voters website to finally, again, arrange a time to pick up his ballot from the HoCo. Elections office. We did complete and drop our ballots in the ballot box. My concern is that if it was this difficult for someone like myself, who has been very involved in the political processes over the past several years, to obtain a ballot and be able to vote, that for some people these problems would result in them not voting. People without online capabilities or even without a car to be able to personally pick up their ballots. It should not be this difficult to exercise our basic right to vote. I hope these issues will be resolved before the November election and that the right to vote by mail will not be taken away.

I am 77 years old and need a walker to get around at the present time. I received a call-back later in the afternoon and was told that Montgomery County was having issues with about 65,000 ballots and if I didn't receive mine by Wednesday, I should request a ballot again. Then today, I received a message from another source that said to write to absentee@montgomerycountymd.gov which I did. I explained the situation and attached a copy of my original application for an absentee ballot. I had received confirmation of my original request. Also, when I used the "status" link it has said, for more than two weeks, that my ballot has been sent. I asked for a new ballot to be mailed to me or delivered electronically. Of course, I got an auto-reply that they were out of the office. With Monday being a holiday, I hope to hear something by Tuesday.</p> <p>My ballot arrived on Tuesday, May 26th, without having to make further contact with the state of local Boards of Elections. My guess is that my ballot was mailed later because I had requested an absentee ballot before June 2nd became a primarily mail-in election.</p>

Eventually, the Saturday a week before the election, I was told that I could drive up to BOE in Gaithersburg, MD to pick up a ballot. The Tuesday, before election day, I received a call and t was assured that a paper ballot would be mailed to me. Ultimately , I received my paper ballot the Friday before election day. Irony is that I spent countless hours working on #SafeVote and GOTV and USCIS to naturalize citizens--but could not get my own ballot!</p>

Thank you for providing KO Public Affairs LLC the opportunity to develop, implement and oversee a statewide public awareness campaign to encourage individuals to participate in the State's first vote by mail election on June 2, 2020. Under the scope of work, KO was charged with developing a statewide campaign, including earned media, TV, radio, and digital to supplement the State Board of Election's social media campaign. The public education campaign also included broad stakeholder engagement to help educate voters about the vote by mail election.

In order to build the campaign, KO partnered with a number of stakeholder firms to help us develop the campaign and reach target audiences throughout the State.

Our partners included:

- **Mission Media** – a full-service advertising and marketing firm to assist with creative design, campaign production and media buying.
- **Sandy Hillman Communications** – a public relations firm and minority business enterprise to assist with earned media and oversee broad stakeholder engagement throughout the state.
- **GreiBO** – a public relations and marketing firm based in Baltimore to assist with stakeholder outreach to the African American community statewide, including key influencer messaging, in-community events and social media for Baltimore City residents.
- **Cool & Associates** – a full-service management consulting firm that brings Hispanic strategy, workforce development, education, marketing and outreach to the forefront of any organization. Veronica Cool and her team assisted with stakeholder outreach to the Latinx community, Spanish-speaking earned media, and assisted with translation of all

campaign materials, including radio, social media, and a web-tutorial created by the State Board of Elections.

- **Campfire Communications** – is a full-service communications firm led by Henry Fawell. Along with Hillman Communications, Campfire helped to drive earned media coverage, stakeholder outreach and rapid respond during the campaign.

While the media buy, along with creative design and production, with Mission Media accounted for almost 80% of the overall budget for the emergency procurement, nearly 70% of the remaining budget went to the MBE firms above for statewide stakeholder outreach, earned media, translation services, Spanish-speaking paid media, and in-community engagement for Baltimore City.

Overall the public education campaign, through a combination of paid media, earned media and stakeholder engagement, reached millions of Maryland voters in the three weeks leading up to the June 2 primary. Some highlights of the campaign include:

- Traditional media reached millions of Marylanders across the state, including TV, radio and print,
- The digital campaign resulted in 84,540,096 impressions,
- 4,648,105 views of the campaign videos (not including those who saw the video on TV) and 554,917 clicks on the ads,
- More than 740 journalists at more than 330 small, medium and large outlets in every county of our state, resulting in 227 media placements during the three-week campaign.
- Nearly 700 stakeholder organizations were engaged to share vote by mail election details
- Approximately 20,000 flyers were distributed in Baltimore City through COVID-19 safe street teams, Black Girls Vote and food distribution sites partnering with Thread and Johns Hopkins.

While there were communications challenges during the campaign, most notably with ballots arriving later than expected and the need to add drop box and voting locations in Baltimore City, the campaign was successful in helping to educate Maryland voters about the election, how to vote-by-mail, where to vote in person or drop their ballots, and how to obtain a ballot if their ballot did not arrive by mail. The campaign included messaging to make sure voters understood that their ballot was valid even though it contained the original April 28 primary date and the need for voters to sign the oath on the back of the envelope.

As a collective team, we are proud to have played a role in helping to educate Maryland voters about the election process, and believe the campaign helped to achieve significant voter turnout surpassing that of the 2016 primary.

Attached we have included an analysis of the paid media campaign, including both traditional and digital platforms, and the results of the earned media and stakeholder outreach program.

Strategy Overview

OVERALL STRATEGY

- ★ To promote awareness of Maryland's primary election on June 2, traditional and digital media campaigns targeted residents across the state to inform them of mail-in and in-person voting options. The campaigns ran from 5/15/20 to 6/2/20 with the exception of Google Search which started on 5/8/20. Traditional media started 5/18/20.
- ★ The campaigns targeted all eligible Maryland households geographically by splitting the state into regions which were given budgets relative to their total populations.
- ★ The campaigns promoted awareness of the mail-in vote, steps necessary to mail the ballot securely, and in-person voting options.

DIGITAL STRATEGY OVERVIEW

- ★ The Google Search campaigns were launched early to accommodate piqued interest due to the historic mail-in vote.
- ★ The digital campaigns targeted all eligible Maryland households geographically by splitting all of the state's counties into five geographic regions which were given budgets relative to their total population.
- ★ In addition to the targeting of Maryland households, registered voters provided by the State Board of Elections were targeted on platforms that allowed email address targeting matching.

TRADITIONAL STRATEGY OVERVIEW

- ★ Print, Radio, TV, and OTT (over-the-top/streaming) channels were used to spread awareness across all parts of the state.
 - ★ Additional station-owned streaming and digital impressions augmented the traditional media buys.
- ★ A broad audience was targeted by media market, with market budgets determined by each area's relative population.
- ★ Radio stations were selected across all genres to reach a diverse voting population.
- ★ TV was largely focused on news programming, with limited Prime programming as well.
- ★ The Baltimore Sun and Washington Post utilized a mix of Print and Digital to reach their full readership.

AFRICAN AMERICAN AND LATINO STRATEGY OVERVIEW

- ★ Specific paid outreach was targeted at Latino and African American residents throughout the state.
- ★ A mix of Print (including Spanish language ads), Radio (including a Spanish radio spot), Influencer and Video pushed through Social Media was used to reach individuals in Baltimore and around the state.

NOTABLE HIGHLIGHTS

- ★ The digital campaign received 84,540,096 impressions during its run, as well as 554,917 clicks and 4,648,105 plays of the video.
- ★ We've tracked 470,925 users to the landing page directly from the campaign (not including those who may have seen an ad and come back later to the website). The average user is staying on the landing page for :37 seconds, which improved from the :26 seconds reported on in the mid campaign report.
- ★ The campaigns to Maryland households spent in full daily to reach Maryland residents in all counties.
- ★ Google Display led to 61,841,949 impressions (73.15% of total) meaning this channel drove the most views on the campaign ads.

NOTABLE HIGHLIGHTS, CON'T.

- ★ In addition to the traditional media placements, the :30 video ran as an ad on YouTube and on Facebook. The average cost per view of the video was \$0.02 which allowed us to get an extremely high number of views for the media budgets.
- ★ The registered voter list provided by the State Board of Elections targeted registered voters on Gmail, Google Display, Snapchat, and Facebook/Instagram. This tactic proved extremely effective at directing the message to those who are more likely to vote; the average click-through from a registered voter is 66.15% higher than the general Maryland households targeting.
- ★ On social media, the average user watched :12 seconds of the :30 video. On YouTube the average increases to :22 seconds, or almost the entire video.

- ★ Facebook/Instagram targeted users on their apps as well as the desktop sites with both video and image ads.

Media Relations

Sandy Hillman Communications, in partnership with Veronica Cool & Associates, GreiBO, and Campfire Communications, developed and executed a comprehensive media relations program spanning the state's geographic and demographic landscape. Beginning the week of May 11, the initiative reached more than 740 journalists at more than 330 small, medium and large outlets in every county of our state resulting in 227 media placements during the three-week campaign.

The campaign targeted a wide swath of print, digital and broadcast outlets to ensure essential information about voting by mail reached residents in all parts of the state by their preferred communications platforms. The effort included targeted outreach to minority communities as well as geographic regions with historically low voter turn-out rates.

Eleven separate news announcements over the three weeks served as the basis for the media relations initiative. As well, our team shared any clarifying statements made by the State Board Elections during the three-week campaign and responded to and fielded myriad requests from media organizations. Many of the news releases were customized to include jurisdiction-specific information such as the locations of local in-person voting centers and ballot drop-off sites, while other news releases conveyed critical statewide messages. Each of the 11 core announcements was issued in both English and Spanish.

Stakeholder Outreach Strategy

Our stakeholder outreach strategy was to focus on regularly communicating with influential organizations that have broad demographic and geographic reach, touching niche and general populations and all corners of the state. As trusted voices in their communities, we asked them to share a continuous flow of vote by mail information with their constituents. We successfully engaged 743 organizations statewide, who in turn got the vote by mail message out to thousands of potential voters via their own communications platforms be that newsletters, bulletins, emails or social media.

Tomorrow is Maryland Primary Election Day

Voters Still Have Time to Cast Ballots by Mail

ANNAPOLIS (June 1, 2020) – The Maryland State Board of Elections strongly encourages all eligible voters to exercise their right to vote in tomorrow's primary election. Those wishing to vote by mail still have an opportunity to do so, as ballots must be postmarked no later than tomorrow (June 2) in order to be counted.

Those who are unable to vote by mail may submit their completed ballots at designated ballot drop-off locations located in every local jurisdiction. Eligible voters may also cast their ballots at a limited number of in-person voting locations around the state. Same-day registration will be available at designated voting centers for eligible voters who choose to vote in-person tomorrow.

A full list of ballot box and in-person voting centers is available online. Eligible voters may submit their ballots at drop box locations until 8 p.m. tomorrow. In-person voting centers will be open tomorrow from 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.

Due to the novel coronavirus pandemic, voting for tomorrow's primary will be conducted primarily by mail. The pandemic also resulted in the date of the Primary being postponed from April 28.

Mail-in ballots for tomorrow's primary have been sent by U.S. Postal Service to all eligible state voters at addresses provided to the Maryland State Board of Elections. While the mail-in ballots received by voters display the original Primary date of April 28, the ballots are in fact valid for tomorrow's election. Voters should be aware these are official ballots that will record actual votes. They are not sample ballots.

The return ballot must be postmarked no later than June 2 but can be mailed at any time before election day. Voters should sign only the oath on the outside of the envelope but not the ballot itself.

The Maryland State Board of Elections strongly encourages all voters who can cast their ballots by mail to do so. Voting by mail is safe, secure and free. No postage is required to vote by mail. Voters simply fill out their ballot, sign the oath on the envelope and place it back in the mail.

Votes cast by mail remain secret. The same technology and equipment used for in-person voting is utilized to count mail-in ballots. The equipment is never connected to the Internet or any other database.

The Maryland State Board of Elections is committed to educating voters on the changes made to the election procedures due to the novel coronavirus epidemic. These changes have been made to ensure voters can exercise their fundamental right to vote while also safeguarding the public's health during this pandemic.

The return ballot must be postmarked no later than June 2 but can be mailed at any time before election day. Voters should sign only the oath on the outside of the envelope but not the ballot itself.

The Maryland State Board of Elections strongly encourages all voters who can cast their ballots by mail to do so. Voting by mail is safe, secure and free. No postage is required to vote by mail. Voters simply fill out their ballot, sign the oath on the envelope and place it back in the mail.

Votes cast by mail remain secret. The same technology and equipment used for in-person voting is utilized to count mail-in ballots. The equipment is never connected to the Internet or any other database.

Summary

Starting on 5/11/20, Cool & Associates LLC (Cool) launched a three-week outreach campaign to inform, promote and motivate eligible Latinos and Spanish-speakers to vote in the Maryland 2020 Primary Presidential Election of June 2, 2020.

Cool & Associates LLC reached Spanish speakers through an extensive outreach campaign to various stakeholders via various means, including traditional media and community outreach, coupled with nontraditional grassroots efforts including text, What'sApp and social media engagement. The outreach included interviews on various Hispanic media platforms, paid and earned, across Maryland and the Greater Washington Metropolitan area.

The following is a summary of our efforts including:

- **Media Outreach-** managing and facilitating interviews with designated Spanish-speaking spokespeople. Veronica Cool also served as media spokesperson
- **Stakeholder Outreach-** engaging and informing hundreds of organizations that actively engaged and serve thousands of latinos and Spanish-speakers.
- **Content Development-** developed content for SBE to engage Spanish-speaker across various platforms, including revising video content and subtitles. Recreated 30-second video asset with Spanish subtitles to support outreach efforts.
- **Translations-** translated over 20 creative assets and press releases, on a same-day, expedited manner to ensure almost same-time communication to align with the English outreach efforts.

Outreach to Stakeholders

Over the course of 23 days, Cool & Associates connected with **260** Stakeholders that included Latino Influencers and Community Leaders, Embassies and Consulates, Hispanic Churches, and various professional associations and organizations including business and chambers of commerce throughout Maryland. The following is a break-down of the Stakeholders by categories:

- Latino Influencers and Community Leaders - 58
- Churches with Hispanic Congregations - 80
- Various Hispanic Professional Associations and Business Organizations - 103
- Embassies/Consulates - 19

Outreach to Hispanic Media Outlets

Cool distributed all news releases and statements to over 110+ contacts in Hispanic media outlets that serve the State of Maryland and the Greater Washington DC area. We garnered over 15 interviews and dozens of media placements.

We were able to leverage Dr. Gilberto Zelaya, with the Montgomery County Board of Elections as well as Veronica Cool as media spokespeople.

Additionally, Cool served a Spanish-media buyer for strategic outreach, including El Zol Radio, Radio America and Somos Baltimore Latino.



In the past the Board has considered the following facts in determining whether just cause exists to grant a waiver.

- Administrative error of any kind on the part of the Division.
- The lateness is due to extenuating circumstances, i.e. physical illness or death in the family.
- The late report is the first late report and allows the committee to close, or contains minimal financial activity.
- The fee will cause undue financial hardship, if the liability of the fine is the personal responsibility of the officers.
- Computer problems occurred which made timely filing impossible. However, the filer still must have demonstrated a good faith effort to timely file.

Prior to the meeting please review each waiver request. Note the recommendations that you may disagree with or have questions on that you would like to discuss.

Pursuant to Election Law Article §13-337 (b) (3), the State Administrator has denied eight waiver request, for the month of May. No Board action is required on the denials. Late fees collected year to date for Late Fee Waivers are \$25,270.00.







To Whom This Concerns,

From the beginning there were issues between the Candidate and myself. They didn't appear significant at first, but over time kept showing up and progressively grew more problematic.

I met with Maureen Bryant at her home on 1301 Sea Shell Court, Stony Beach, MD 21226, for an initial meeting to learn and discuss the needs and duties for her campaign. I found out later that residence was NOT in the District she planned to run candidacy in. Afterwards she indicated renting at an address on Cleveland Ave in Linthicum, MD for her campaign. Whether she sold her residence or not, I am not aware. That was the first thing that I learned some time afterwards, probably a month or two that I found out.

Close to that time when we had created and opened her campaign banking account, we met at The Columbia Bank (now, Fulton Bank) just across from my apartment building on Dorchester Blvd, Hanover. She gave \$20 just for the initial deposit to get the account established. That amount didn't change for at least 2 months afterward, maybe a little more.

During that time, I learned from club associates that they had seen lawn signs for her around the Linthicum area. I was never notified by her or anyone else that a purchase was made for those signs in terms of how many, the cost involved and no invoice. Yet, I noticed no change in deposits or withdrawals as the account balance had not changed from the original \$20 when I learned of and saw the lawn signs.

I drove around Linthicum and found some of those lawn signs, and took pictures as I noticed the authorized by statement did NOT have the Treasurer's name, which was me.

I brought this to her attention and she claimed it was a mistake. Explained it was the campaign manager that did it. Again, I had to press about the money involved that we had to get that identified as it never showed up in the campaign account.

Following that there was considerable mail being delivered to me clearly meant for her attention. While I gave it to her and mentioned it as well, it didn't seem to be corrected.

Sometime later, I learned – again, from a club member, that she had been using a GoFundMe account for her fundraisers. I was never informed of that by her or anyone. Again, these funds never were deposited within the Columbia Bank account. I confronted her on this and said we have to have the contact info of all who gave you funds for the sake of reporting. While I got names and some amounts, I

never got the contact info from any of them. I asked her more than twice for that info but never heard from her.

By this time, I contacted the SBE with this matter and subsequently directed to await contact from an investigator, Cynthia F. Thomas of The Office of The State Prosecutor. We did talk by phone and I brought all this (above) to her attention. She asked, and I sent her color copies of the pictures I took of those lawn signs she could read what was on the signs. I never heard anything more from her on that issue although I did explain to her why I was so concerned to bring this up in the first place.

During this – campaign – I was employed by Northrop Grumman (Defense Industry). These incidents with this campaign and what I was dealing with posed a very serious concern to me being an employee with certain credentials. It put me in a bind which made me very upset as I had sensitive responsibilities with my work, my management, my future and seemed to me that was quite unacceptable that this person had put me in given my security level. That's been the sole reason I had to bring this to the attention of the SBE and the investigator.

Even after this, at some point, I received a phone call from someone at the SBE to ask why the campaign account was closed at the time (after July 2018, don't know exact date). Which was an extreme surprise to me. I had mentioned to whom I spoke that it would be better that they contact the candidate immediately. It seemed soon after that the account was reconstituted shortly afterward. If memory serves, I recall the reason this happened had to do with a returned check to the SBE for a small late fee charge as I had personally stopped at West Street to provide that check. But that was absolutely the last straw to me as I kept trying to do my best despite all that was, and was not being done by the candidate herself.

Shortly after this, the last report that was filed to SBE indicated a final balance within the bank (The Columbia Bank) of \$1,690.91 for the report period ending on 8/21/2018. That report indicated I had signed and transmitted it to Maureen Bryant and the SBE on 8/28/2018. Recently, I had gone to the bank (now the Fulton Bank). Their records show that Maureen Bryant had actually gone to that bank and closed the account, removing \$1,690.91. As a result, the balance has been zero since that very date.

I've been a responsible treasurer for other organizations in the past, in particular my lodge affiliation since 1988 to about 10 years ago, I think. I'm not new at this function. But I am absolutely outraged at Maureen Bryant and what she has done to use me the way she did.

I hope this is sufficient to explain the issues I had to contend with to provide the data that was needed for the regular reports. Most data provided was correct and complete, but a fair amount was lacking that I could not provide despite my attempts at getting it.

All I know is that sours what used to be my willingness to help and work with others from then to the future. I doubt very much I will ever volunteer for such a thing ever again.

I respectfully request a waiver of any late fees with regard to the above.

Please accept this letter as an appeal regarding the decision to assess a late penalty fee regarding the late filing of my campaign finance report. Beyond the excessive fee applied, I am saddened by the negative impact on my integrity and reputation. Throughout the campaign, my treasurer completed all reports in a thorough and timely fashion. When I was appointed to the Allegany County Board of Education in January 2019, I made the incorrect assumption that as long as the remaining funds remained untouched, no further reports were needed. Here are additional pieces of information that are important in the decision to assess late fees:

- During the campaign, all of the reminder emails regarding reports appeared in my Gmail account. Additionally, your office mailed reminder cards. In the case of the required January report (of which I was unaware, and I do assume responsibility for that), your email went directly into Updates, a filtering mechanism that I did not create for spam and ads. I did not see this email until I received the reminder card at the end of January. I know that this is not the fault of the State Board of Elections, but I want to let you know that I did not see any notifications.
- Immediately upon receipt of this card, I called my treasurer. He reported also not receiving an email but immediately called the SBE office to ask questions regarding this report. These calls occurred the first week of February.
- He believed he entered the required information and was unaware that a simple affidavit was all that was required in the case of an account with zero transactions. We have always completed the finance reports and emailed them in a timely fashion so he would have no reason to believe that that had not occurred this time.
- The only other notification that it had not been received was received in the mail on April 28, 2020. After receiving the letter, I went back and checked my Gmail account. Again, a notice dated April 21 was directed to Update (not the primary email inbox). Regardless, I received no notification from the State Board of Elections until well over two months had elapsed from when the treasurer believed he had submitted the report.
- The affidavit was filed when I was able to meet with the Treasurer to review his reports to date for accuracy. This occurred on May 1, 2020.

I believe that the \$1000.00 late fee is excessive, particularly given that no transactions have occurred since January 2019 and that we were not notified that the report had not been received by your office until so much time had passed (and late fees allowed to accrue over that period). It is obvious by the Treasurer's phone calls in early February that we knew a report was due. I would be more than willing to pay any accrued late fees from when the report was due in January until we attempted to complete it in February because that was my oversight as noted in the first paragraph.

LWV Maryland Statement on Primary Election

In the June 2nd primary Maryland took the bold step of enabling all registered voters to cast a ballot by mail. However, we saw many issues related to voter access and transparency in the election system that could undermine voters' trust. LWVMD calls upon the Governor and our election administrators to take the necessary steps to prevent the same issues from recurring in November and maintain voters' confidence in our democratic system.

Planning for the November general election needs to start immediately, and resources must be allocated to do it right. LWVMD is advocating for the following:

***Declare without delay that the General Election be conducted principally by mail.** It is not clear that the current health and safety concerns will be resolved by November. Voters must have this safe option and election officials need to know *now* what kind of election they will be implementing.

*** Improve ballot delivery and confirm accuracy for all Maryland voters.** No voter should sit out an election because the wrong ballot was mailed to them or it was received too late. Election administrators must conduct a thorough analysis of the Primary and improve the mailing process and verify the accurate ballot for every voter.

*** Establish a reliable cure process for ballots marked for rejection.** If election administrators find a mistake or discrepancy in a voter's ballot, that voter must be notified and given an accessible opportunity to cure it.

*** Engage a community based task force with connections to hard to reach populations.** Use them to provide guidance on alternative means to educate voters who were not reached during the primary election and provide feedback on such issues as ballot drop-box placement.

*** Ensure transparency in the ballot counting process.** Voters must have assurance that their ballot is counted securely and fairly.

*** Implement a robust staffing plan for election board call centers and email support centers.** LWVMD and other partners reported people were experiencing sometimes hours-long wait times on the phone or waiting days for email responses when reaching out with questions. All citizens should be able to gain quick and easy access to the information they need to cast their ballot.

No voter should be disenfranchised by a problem-ridden election. By implementing these changes, Maryland officials can re-establish voters' confidence in our electoral system.

The Montgomery County Board of Elections (hereinafter "MCBOE") is requesting that a third envelope be utilized for all vote by mail/absentee ballots for the 2020 General Election. Md. Code Ann., Election Art., § 9-310(a)(1) through (3) provides:

§ 9-310. Envelope, oath, and instructions

(a) Online ballots sent by mail. --

(1) This subsection applies only to an absentee ballot that is sent by mail.

(2) An absentee ballot shall be enclosed in specially printed envelopes, the form and content of which shall be prescribed by the State Board.

(3)

(i) A local board may use either two envelopes or three envelopes.

(ii) If two envelopes are used, the inner envelope shall be designated the "ballot/return envelope," and, when issued, it shall fit inside the envelope designated the "outgoing envelope."

(iii) If three envelopes are used, the innermost envelope shall be designated the "ballot envelope", which shall fit inside the envelope designated the "return envelope", both of which, when issued, shall fit inside the envelope designated the "outgoing envelope".

Some of our voters have voiced concerns that the design of the vote by mail ballot compromised their privacy because there was no privacy envelope to prevent individuals from viewing their full name, signature and other information on the side of the envelope where the voter executed the oath. While section 9-310 addresses absentee voting, MCBOE believes that the intent of the statute is to address privacy concerns associated with

voting by mail. MCBOE therefore requests the use of a third envelope for the General Election and that our staff have input on any request for proposals regarding the design of the envelopes for voting by mail in Montgomery County.
