Administrator's Report – May 2021

Announcements & Important Meetings

New Employee

We welcome Devki Dave to our Campaign Finance Division. Devki is an experienced trilingual Maryland State government professional with over 7 years of business and management-based experience previously with the Maryland Department of Labor. She is a highly organized, critical thinker who demonstrates leadership and embraces strong teamwork.

State Employees' Appreciation Day

We made it a week, instead of a day (May 5)! Although there are not enough ways to thank the employees of SBE and recognize their work over the last year, we tried. We had a virtual staff meeting where employees should thank others, provided Cinco de Mayo themed food for those in the office one day, and had a virtual meeting where we shared interesting and silly information about ourselves. These virtual meetings enabled us to see people we haven't seen in a while and reconnect with each other.

Election Directors' Meetings

We hosted an election directors' meeting on May 20th. Topics discussed included voter registration, the inventory process, and the project to replace the electronic pollbooks for the 2022 elections. A summary of the meeting is provided with the County Bulletin when it is complete.

SBE's Biennial Meeting and Maryland Association of Election Officials' (MAEO) Annual Conference MAEO is hosting its annual conference in Ocean City the week of August 23. SBE will host its mandatory, biennial meeting on August 25, with virtual access available for individuals who prefer not to attend in person. Meeting details are being developed and will be distributed once finalized.

Election Reform and Management

Student and Military Voters: Information and New Process

<u>Senate Bill 283</u> and <u>House Bill 156</u> of the 2021 Legislative Session (effective June 1, 2021) requires certain information on our website for college students and the acceptance of the electronic signatures affixed by the U.S. Department of Defense's Common Access Card for certain transactions. <u>Our updated website</u> includes the required information for college students, and proposed changes to regulations will be presented at this meeting to incorporate the Common Access Card requirements of these bills. The Voter Registration Division is updating procedures for the local boards to allow for electronic signatures on certain documents if the electronic signature is affixed by the Common Access Card.

SBE has joined Instagram

We have recently joined Instagram as @md_sbe. This new social media account will allow us to further expand our voter education outreach, along with our communications and customer service efforts. You can find us on Twitter, Facebook, YouTube and now Instagram.

Mail-In Voting: Usability Review

<u>Chapter 56 (Senate Bill 683)</u> and <u>House Bill 1048</u> (effective June 1, 2021) requires that we have a usability expert review and provide recommendations on mail-in voting information available to voters. We are working with the University of Baltimore (UB) on an agreement for usability experts at UB to perform this work and expect that the majority of the work will be performed during the summer.

These laws also create a permanent absentee voting list for voters and allow these voters to select how they wish election officials to communicate with them (*i.e.*, mail, text, or email). To implement these

changes, we are updating the impacted systems - MDVOTERS, the statewide voter registration, candidacy, and election management system - and the online systems voters can use to request mail-in ballots.

High Speed Envelope Sorter Solution

Last month, we issued a Request for Information to learn about available high speed envelope sorting solutions. Several of the large local boards are interested in solutions to expedite the processing and sorting of returned envelopes with voted mail-in ballots. The deadline for vendors to submit information was May 21, and three vendors provided information about their products. We will share this information with interested local boards and determine our next steps.

Voter Registration

MDVOTERS

Training classes are being held or planned in the near future for election judge training assignments and proper address entry and general information for districts and precincts to assist with the redistricting process.

MDVOTERS Audits

At least 44 audits are performed monthly, and audits cover the following transactions:

- New registrations
- Changes to voter records
- Timely processing of reports
- Cancellations
- Party changes
- Absentee application
- Electronic Registration Information Center (ERIC)

Each month, the local boards audit another local board's transactions. SBE reviews the monthly data audits performed by the local boards, and these reviews require accessing 144 files.

Motor Vehicle Administration (MVA) Transactions

During April, MVA collected the following voter registration transactions:

New Registration - 11,020 Residential Address Changes - 20,183

Last name changes - 2,771 Political Party Changes - 4,638

MVA Notice of Surrendered Licenses from Other States

With assistance from MVA, SBE will be receiving information on Maryland drivers who have surrendered their Maryland licenses to another state's driver license agency. We anticipate receiving the data during June or July. When we receive this data, a notification will be generated to the voter in accordance with federal National Voter Registration Act (NVRA) guidelines.

Non-Citizen Registration and Voting

Between February 1, 2021 and April 30, 2021, 96 voter records were cancelled due to a status of non-citizen. None of these individuals have voting history.

Jared DeMarinis and Mary Cramer Wagner continue to work with the Office of the State Prosecutor regarding the best method to report to the Board the findings of their investigations.

Candidacy and Campaign Finance (CCF) Division

Candidacy

Individuals must file certain paperwork, pay a filing fee, and appear in person to become a candidate for the 2022 election. The filings are currently scheduled by appointment, and as of May 25, 28 candidates have filed at SBE.

Campaign Finance

The next disclosure report due is for persons doing business with State government entities and persons employing lobbyists. They are required to file a *Disclosure of Contributions* every six months (November 30 and May 31) with the transaction period ending the last day of the month prior to the due date. Currently, over 425 statements have been received for the Spring 2021 filing. There are over 850 entities registered in the system. Since May 31 is a legal holiday, the statement is due on June 1. Failure to file will result in late fees. Late filing fees are calculated in the same method as campaign finance report late filings with the maximum penalty of \$1,000.

In April, MD Campaign Reporting Information System (MD CRIS) website was visited by over 230,000 individuals for an average of over 7,700 per day. Additionally, it had over 1.6 million hits. Each viewer looked at an average of nearly 6 page views per day. The Business Contribution Disclosure System (BCDS) website had over 810,000 hits, over 42,000 visitors with an average of over 18 page views per day.

Project Management Office (PMO)

Inventory Management

The FY21 Inventory Audit started on February 1 and will conclude on June 30, 2021. The current statewide inventory audit completion is 86.32%.

FY2022 Electronic Pollbook Project

The PMO continued working on tasks related to the project, including:

- The procurement of a new electronic pollbook system is in the evaluation phase with the onsite evaluation of the vendors' equipment. This phase is expected to be completed in mid-June.
- Shared project information to the local boards via monthly project status meetings and the biweekly *County Bulletins*.
- Updated and addressed questions concerning the pollbook's Contingency Plan.
- Planning for the post-evaluation (*e.g.*, request for Board of Public Works approval) and the implementation phases of the project.

Other

The Central Warehouse team continued to work on a number of activities and events at the facility that included:

- Receiving equipment and supplies from local boards requesting storage or that will be going through the disposal process.
- Logistics planning and scheduling of the statewide pickup and delivery of equipment involved in the potential voting system upgrade.

DECLARATION OF QUORUM PRESENT

Mr. Hogan called the meeting to order at 2:01 pm and declared that a quorum was present.

ADDITIONS TO THE AGENDA

There were no additions to the agenda.

ELECTION OF CHAIRMAN

Mr. Hogan nominated Mr. Voelp as chairman, and Mr. Funn seconded. The motion passed unanimously. Mr. Hogan congratulated Mr. Voelp and turned the meeting over to the newly-elected chairman to preside over the remainder of the meeting. Mr. Voelp thanked the other members for electing him as chairman.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mr. Hogan made a motion to approve the minutes from the February 11, 2021 open meeting, the February 11, 2021 closed meeting, and the March 26, 2021 closed meeting. Mr. Miller seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT

Ms. Charlson stated that only highlights of the Administrator's Report would be presented verbally, but that the full report is available on the SBE website.

Announcements & Important Meetings

Election Directors' Meetings

Ms. Charlson reported that SBE hosted election directors' meetings on March 18 and April 15. A summary of the March 18 meeting was provided with the meeting materials, and a summary of the April 15 meeting will be provided when it is complete.

FY2022 Budget & FY2021 Deficiency Requests

Ms. Charlson reported that the General Assembly recently approved our FY2022 budget and deficiency fund request for FY2021. The approved FY2022 budget includes two additional positions, one in IT and one in election policy, as well as additional funding for voter outreach and election judges training

HR 1 & S 1 - Federal Election Legislation

On March 3, 2021, the U.S. House of Representatives passed H.R. 1. This legislation has widespread impact on election administration with provisions ranging from voter registration to mail-in voting to election administration to campaign finance to redistricting. In mid-March, similar legislation - S. 1 - was introduced in the US Senate. The Senate's Committee on Rules and Administration is expected to mark up the bill in May.

Maryland Association of Election Officials (MAEO) - Annual Conference

MAEO is hosting its annual conference in Ocean City the week of August 23. We will provide more information as the agenda and registration information is developed. Discussions on whether to host SBE's biennial meeting during this conference are on-going.

Election Reform and Management

Manual Audit

Ms. Hartman reported that the manual audit from the 2020 General Election was completed on February 26, 2021 with the manual audit of Washington County. In 21 of the 24 local jurisdictions, there were zero differences between the results of the manual audit and the voting system. In the remaining three local jurisdictions, two discrepancies were determined to be human error, and the other discrepancy was a one vote discrepancy and well below the 0.5% threshold to trigger more auditing. As required by Election Law Article, §11-309(d)(4), a report of the manual audit was posted on our <u>Ballot Audit Plan webpage</u>. Information about the independent software audit is also posted there.

U.S. Election Assistance Commission (EAC) Data Report

Ms. Hartman reported that after each general election, the EAC asks states to complete an extensive data survey. The survey - called the Election Administration and Voting Survey - requests data on voter registration, voter turnout, mail-in voting by military and overseas voters and domestic, civilian voters, provisional voting, voting locations, pollworkers, and voting systems.

The initial submission for the EAC's 2020 Election Administration and Voting Survey was due and SBE submitted timely on February 1, 2021. The EAC returned the data report two weeks later with suggested corrections, and a final certified report was submitted and accepted by the EAC on March 6, 2021. Ms. Hartman thanked Susan Tang who assisted in completion of this report.

Voter Registration

MDVOTERS

Ms. Wilbon-Turner reported that MDVOTERS 7.5 version will be released on April 26 and includes the full integration of the Agency Election Management System (AEMS). Some of the functionality includes the generation of web accessible HTML candidate lists and election results pages, ballot generation and ballot style reporting, write-in vote result processing, candidate nomination certificates, candidate commissions of election, canvass sheets for certifying elections and electoral college documentation in addition to providing an interface to the voting system and other modules within MDVOTERS.

Ms. Lamone thanked Natasha Walker, Director of Election Management Systems at SBE, for leading this project from start to finish over the last three years, in addition to her regular duties.

Motor Vehicle Administration (MVA) Transactions

Ms. Wagner explained that under federal and State law, MVA is required to offer voter registration during certain MVA transactions. Since MVA is the primary source of new voter registration and updated voter registration information, we provide monthly data on voter registration activity generated by MVA transactions. Ms. Wagner stated that the voter registration transactions are listed in the full report provided to the members.

Electronic Registration Information Center (ERIC)

Ms. Wagner reported that ERIC is a non-profit organization, formed in 2012, with the sole mission of assisting states to improve the accuracy of voter registration rolls. Currently, 30 states and the District of Columbia form ERIC's membership.

Each member submits to ERIC its voter registration and motor vehicle licensee data for comparison and review. Various reports are generated and returned to the states for action. These reports include voters who have moved within their state, voters who moved out of state, duplicate registrations in the same state, and death records from the Social Security Administration (SSA).

Maryland receives these reports every other month, and each local board of elections process these reports within 2 weeks of receipt. Beginning May 2021, Maryland will receive SSA death and in-state duplicate records on a monthly basis.

To learn more about ERIC, Ms. Wagner encouraged those interested to visit <u>www.ericstates.org</u>.

In response to a question from Mr. Voelp, Ms. Wilbon-Turner reported that SBE has begun to receive data on surrendered driver's licenses and we are currently parsing through the data. Ms. Wagner stated that she will include that data in her report next month.

MDVOTERS Audits

Ms. Wagner reported that Janet Smith is a voter registration auditor for SBE. These audits include, but are not limited to:

- New registrations;
- Changes to voter records;
- Timely processing of reports:
- Cancellations;
- Party changes;
- Absentee application

Once audits are reported to the local board of elections for correction, Ms. Smith audits those records to make sure the corrections have been made.

MDVOTERS Access Security

Ms. Wagner explained that in order to access the statewide voter registration database (MDVOTERS), users must have a two factor authentication token. The MDVOTERS user accounts are audited frequently, and unused accounts are removed. Any token that has not been

immediately reassigned must be returned to SBE.

Non-Citizen Registration and Voting

Ms. Wagner reported that non-citizens registered to vote are identified and forwarded to the Office of the State Prosecutor (OSP.) OSP and SBE are working to improve the process and review and identify records identified from March 20, 2020 to March 31, 2021. During that time, 224 individuals had records canceled for non-citizen status and five of these individuals had voting history. Overall, during that same period 219,578 individual voter registration records were cancelled due to other actions - moved out of state, death, voter request and routine voter list maintenance actions.

Mr. Voelp thanked Ms. Wagner for this information and requested that the Board be updated as to the case status of the non-citizens reported to OSP.

Candidacy and Campaign Finance (CCF) Division

<u>Candidacy</u>

Mr. DeMarinis reported that February 23, 2021 was the first day candidates can file candidacy paperwork for the 2022 Gubernatorial Election cycle. Approximately 20 candidates have filed to date.

Campaign Finance

Mr. DeMarinis reported that the prohibition on fundraising during the legislative session has ended.

The next disclosure report due is for persons doing business with State government entities and persons employing lobbyists. Under Title 14 of the Election Law Article, these individuals are required to file a Disclosure of Contributions. Reports are due every six months (November 30 and May 31) with the transaction period ending the last day of the month prior to the due date.

Enforcement

Mr. DeMarinis reported that the CCF Division received payment for the following civil penalties:

- 1. Ironworkers Political Action League PAC paid \$250.00 on February 26, 2021 for the failure to record all contributions and expenditures.
- 2. Friends of Dr. Kathleen White committee paid \$600.00 on March 3, 2021 for the failure to record all contributions and expenditures.
- 3. Craig Carozza-Caviness for county council committee paid \$450.00 on March 3, 2021 for the failure to record all contributions and expenditures.
- 4. Citizens for Jeffrey Kenney committee paid \$200.00 on April 09, 2021 for the failure to record all contributions and expenditures and for filing affidavits instead of a Campaign Finance Report.
- 5. Citizens for Patrick Gutierrez committee paid \$500.00 on April 12, 2021 for the failure to record all contributions and expenditures.

Financial Disclosure Statements

Mr. DeMarinis reminded the Board members that they are required to file a financial disclosure statement with the Ethics Commission. The deadline is April 30, 2021.

MD CRIS Contract - Options Approval

Mr. DeMarinis explained that there are two contracts that support Maryland Campaign Reporting

Information System (MD CRIS), a browser-based campaign committee information and finance reporting system with a module for business contributions to election campaigns. One contract (MDCRIS AP) supports and provides system maintenance and development, business process support and documentation, database management, cybersecurity support to audit the application software and for web security, and incident reporting for the application. The other contract (MD CRIS DC) provides web hosting and security monitoring for MDCRIS, includes data center hardware and software, and provides security monitoring to protect against denial of service (DOS) or breach of personal identifying information (PII). The vendor for both contracts is Netorian, LLC.

At its March 10 meeting, the Board of Public Works (BPW) approved exercising option periods for both MD CRIS contracts. The option period is for 2 years (April 1, 2021- March 31, 2023). After the current term, the contracts have one two-year option left for renewal.

Voting Systems Division

Voting System Upgrade

Mr. Satterfield reported that SBE has begun initial testing of the voting system software suite and firmware upgrades. The voting system upgrade contains significant benefits to the voting equipment and back-end processes associated with election-related activities. On April 19, 2021, SBE began the State certification process for the voting system software suite. The certification process has a 60-day window. The certification timeline will include a public demonstration period for the voting system, which is tentatively scheduled to take place during the month of May.

Transportation Contract

Ms. Charlson reported that at its March 10 meeting, the Board of Public Works (BPW) approved exercising the final option period for our contract with Interstate Moving Solutions. Under this contract, Interstate delivers election equipment and supplies to early voting and election day locations and returns the same equipment and supplies to the local boards' warehouses, schedules, manages, and tracks deliveries, and follows SBE's strict security procedures for moving this equipment and supplies. The option period is for 2 years (July 1, 2021 - June 30, 2023) and covers transporting election equipment and supplies for the 2022 elections.

Project Management Office (PMO)

Inventory Management

Mr. Ross reported that the FY21 Inventory Audit, which is required by state law and is an inventory of physical equipment used by SBE, is 70.26% complete.

Electronic Pollbook Replacement Project

Mr. Ross reported that we are in the third of four major steps in the evaluation phase of the pollbook replacement project, which is the receiving of equipment from vendors so on-site evaluations can be performed. This step will be completed by the evaluation team and is expected to be completed min-June. The project team continues to maintain the project communication with the local boards via monthly project status meetings

Other

Mr. Ross reported that SBE has a warehouse in Glen Burnie that, which also has training facilities, and two SBE employees. These individuals continued:

- Disposing of equipment and supplies through the State's auction and recycling options
- Returning of local board equipment temporarily stored at the warehouse for the 2020

General Election

- Receiving local boards' equipment and supplies for temporary storage
- Coordinating the use of the warehouse facility for the on-site training of the newly added pollbook contract project team members. The coordination included making sure that everyone was adhering to the COVID-19 distancing and face coverings guidelines.

Information Systems & Technology and Security

Mr. Brechbiel reported that Ms. Wilbon-Turner and Mr. Satterfield have been given expanded responsibilities towards making the IT Services & Technology Division (IS&T) an even more cohesive unit in support of election activities.

Software Development

Ms. Wilbon-Turner is expanding her technical management role to include MDVOTERS, Voter Services and now the Pollbook/EPIC team. She will apply her proven technical leadership capabilities to the other software development teams within the IS&T Division to establish a consistent set of methodologies, tools and processes. Mr. Brechbiel expressed his confidence in Ms. Wilbon-Turner's ability to make a positive difference in this new role.

IT Project Management

Mr. Satterfield will add to his current duties to establish and build this new division within IT Systems and Technology. His goal is to work with all teams within IS&T to create and implement a consistent set of IT project management processes and methodologies to enhance visibility and consistency into the way IT project management is conducted at SBE.

Legislation

Ms. Duncan reported that the Department of Legislative Services issued a summary of legislation following the end of the 90 day session, which was included in the meeting materials. She stated that the election section of the 90 Day Report - A Review of the 2021 Legislative Session was included in the report. Ms. Duncan stated that we are currently identifying the requirements of each new law. She thanked Ms. DeMarinis and Ms. Wagner for their hard work on behalf SBE during the legislative session. Ms. DeMarinis and Ms. Wagner highlighted a few bills that passed including expanded early voting hours, a change in how the number of early voting centers is calculated, and changes to public campaign financing. Ms. Charlson stated that many of the laws passed require regulations, which will be presented to the members in the next few months.

In response to a question from Ms. Woodward, Mr. DeMarinis stated that he did not anticipate or was aware of any litigation that might arise from any of the passed legislation.

In response to a question from Mr. Funn regarding the cost split of new early voting centers, Ms. Charlson stated that the answer depends on what the purpose of the cost. Costs related to voting equipment would be a shared cost between SBE and the local boards, but costs related to facility rentals or additional election judges would be fully the responsibility of the local board.

SECURITY BRIEFING

Mr. Treichel reported that SBE has been working diligently with its vendors and public partners to advance SBE's cybersecurity governance, infrastructure, and operations programs. He explained that today's cyber adversaries are better-funded, more organized than ever, and using increasingly more sophisticated methods attacks, with a mission to disrupt US government and private industry. SBE has been responding to these threats through the implementation of our five-part cybersecurity program.

The cornerstone of these programs is a risk-based information security program that is based on the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) Cyber Security Frameworks, which includes standards for governance, architecture, threat and vulnerability management, and incident detection and response. This framework is mandated for federal agencies and is in use in a majority of US organizations. As part of this program, improvements are made based upon indepth and ongoing assessments and penetration testing.

The second part of the cybersecurity program is secure cyber architecture, which implements a zero trust approach that secures not only the perimeter of the framework but helps to contain bad actors even if there is intrusion. The secure cyber architecture also includes a redundant architecture that allows for a fail over if critical systems fail.

The third part of the cybersecurity program is threat and vulnerability detection management. In this segment, SBE works internally and with federal partners to find, track, and mitigate any vulnerabilities in our infrastructure before a bad actor does.

The fourth part of the cybersecurity program is detection and analysis of potential cyber attacks. This includes a security operations center (SOC), which monitors data center activity, applications, webservers, and devices in real time 24/7 to detect and alert any malicious activity. Additionally, the Center for Internet Security provides us with threat detection and alerts. We also work with our partners at DHS' Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Agency (CISA), FBI, and the Maryland Coordination and Analysis Center (MCAC) to monitor for wider-spread attacks that may be happening nationally or globally. We also monitor social media for threats such as impersonation of election officials, misinformation, and fraud. Social media monitoring is not a permanent part of our monitoring efforts.

The final part of the cybersecurity program is the rapid response and remediation of attempts to attack. This includes procedures for a wide range of incident scenarios and regular table top exercises to rehearse and test those procedures, incidence response services at the SOC and datacenter, a continuity of operations (COOP) backup site in the event of a failover, and working closely with our partner organizations including CISA, MCAC, the FBI, and the local boards of elections.

Ms. Charlson explained that Mr. Treichel's security update stems from a Board motion approved several years ago to provide the members with quarterly security updates.

ASSISTANT ATTORNEY GENERAL'S REPORT

Mr. Trento gave an update on the following cases:

1. Fusaro v. Davitt et al., No. 20-1879 (U.S.C.A. for the 4th Cir.). Mr. Trento explained that this is a challenge, brought by a Virginia resident, of the laws that govern access to Maryland's list of registered voters. Plaintiff Dennis Fusaro brought a complaint in federal court alleging that Maryland violates the First and Fourteenth Amendments by limiting access to the voter list to Maryland voters and only for purposes related to the electoral process. The issue of voter access did not reach the District Court due to unrelated but similar litigation happening around the same time, which concluded that the National Voter Registration Act (NVRA) already required that records related to list maintenance be available for public inspection. The Court did reach the issue of limiting access to the voter list only for purposes related to electoral processes and upheld that aspect of the law.

Plaintiff has appealed to the United States Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit, and briefing is now complete. Oral argument has not yet been scheduled.

- 2. Johnson v. Prince George's County Board of Elections, No. CAL16-42799 (Cir. Ct. Prince Georges Cnty.). No change from the last update. This case involves a challenge under the U.S. Constitution and Maryland Constitution and Declaration of Rights to SBE's alleged failure to provide information and access to voter registration and voting resources to eligible voters detained by the Prince Georges County Department of Correction during the 2016 election. The case had been originally filed in the Circuit Court for Prince Georges County but was removed to federal court on the basis of the federal claims asserted by the Plaintiffs. On February 27, 2018, the U.S. District Court for the District of Maryland granted SBE's motion to dismiss the Plaintiffs' federal claims, declined to exercise jurisdiction over the state claims, and remanded the case to the Circuit Court for further proceedings. The parties are awaiting further direction from the court. Mr. Trento noted that legislation passed this year to formalize the process by which individuals who are in detention but are still eligible to vote are required by the Department of Corrections and SBE to be given information and access to voter registration materials and the ability to vote, which may make the outstanding aspects of this case moot.
- 3. National Federation of the Blind, Inc., et al. v. Lamone et al., No. 1:19-CV-02228-ELH (U.S. District Court, D. Md.). On August 1, 2019, the National Federation of the Blind ("NFB"), NFB's Maryland chapter, and three individual plaintiffs filed a lawsuit against the State Administrator and the individual members of the State Board of Elections alleging that SBE's ballot marking device (BMD) policy has, in practice, violated the rights of voters with disabilities "to an equal opportunity vote in person by a secret ballot," in violation of Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act. Plaintiffs seek an order requiring the State Board "in all future elections to offer BMDs to every in-person voter as the default method of voting, with paper ballots offered only to those voters who affirmatively opt out of using the BMD or in cases where there are long lines of people waiting to vote." On September 3, 2019, defendants filed a motion to dismiss the complaint, and on September 20, 2019, plaintiffs filed a motion for a preliminary injunction, seeking relief in time for the November 2020 election. On February 10, 2020, the court denied the defendants' motion to dismiss, and denied the plaintiffs' motion for preliminary injunction, and the parties proceeded to discovery. On October 6, 2020, the parties filed a joint motion to extend the discovery deadline to December 9, 2020, which was granted by the Court. On November 12, 2020, the parties filed a joint motion to stay the case for 60 days to allow for a focused period of settlement discussions, which was also granted by the Court. The stay has since been extended several times and is now set to expire April 26, 2021.
- 4. Chong Su Yi v. Hogan, Nos. 464985, 466396, 480720, 480721, 480722, 480723 (Cir. Ct. Montgomery Cty.). On September 8, 2019, plaintiff Chong Su Yi filed two complaints in the Circuit Court for Montgomery County challenging the results of Maryland's 2018 elections, and naming Governor Larry Hogan as defendant (Nos. 464985, 466396). Specifically, Mr. Yi argued that the results of that election are invalid because of the use of religious facilities as polling places, that the State's use of "scanners" to tabulate ballots is unconstitutional and/or not permitted by federal law, and that the State's identification of candidates' party affiliations on the general election ballot is not permitted by State law. Mr. Yi amended his complaints, and in January 2019 both of his amended complaints were dismissed by the Circuit Court. On January 21, 2020, Mr. Yi appealed from the dismissal in

No. 466396. (Mr. Yi had also previously filed interlocutory appeals from non-final orders, but these were dismissed by the Court of Special Appeals.) On November 4, 2020, the Court of Special Appeals dismissed Mr. Yi's appeal for failure to file a civil information report, but on November 30, 2020 granted Mr. Yi's motion for reconsideration and reinstated the appeal. On April 16, 2021, Mr. Yi filed an informal appellant's brief with the Court of Special Appeals. On April 22, 2021, that brief was rejected for failure to include a certificate of service, and Mr. Yi was directed to refile his brief with the appropriate certificates within 30 days.

Meanwhile, on March 6, 2020, Mr. Yi filed four complaints in the Circuit Court for Montgomery County (Nos. 480720, 480721, 480722, 480723) asserting substantially identical claims to those asserted in his prior two complaints. Beginning on May 15, 2020, Mr. Yi filed amended complaints in these actions, this time adding the State of Maryland as a Defendant in addition to Governor Hogan. Defendants filed motions to dismiss and/or for summary judgment as to these complaints, and on August 25, 2020 those motions were granted. After moving for reconsideration unsuccessfully, on October 9, 2020, plaintiff filed notices of appeal to the Court of Special Appeals in each of these matters. Plaintiff also sought waivers of the filing fees associated these appeals, which were denied. On January 6, 2021, the Court of Special Appeals dismissed the appeals for failure to pay the filing fee. On February 4, 2021, plaintiff filed a petition for writ of certiorari in the Court of Appeals, and also requested waiver of the filing fees. The Court of Appeals granted Mr. Yi's request for waiver of filing fees and was scheduled to consider Mr. Yi's petition at conference on March 25, 2021. The petition for certiorari is still pending.

OLD BUSINESS

SPEAKERS

Linda Dorsey-Walker, Baltimore County Resident

Ms. Dorsey-Walker reported that she has attended all meetings of the State Board over the last year, and frequently reports information from the meetings to the community. She stated that there was a need for the members of the State Board of establish sanctions against any local board of election's director under certain conditions, as well as two proactive protective measures to prevent the need for such sanctions. Ms. Dorsey-Walker alleged that during the last election cycle, an election director did not discuss with the County Executive the option for each local board to have one additional early voting center, and that the County Executive was not aware of this option until Ms. Dorsey-Walker informed the County Executive about this option. Ms. Dorsey-Walker suggested that, in order to prevent this from happening in the future, there should be written proof that the election director has informed the County Executive of this option, and that the County Executive has either accepted or declined the additional early voting center. Mr. Miller thanked Ms. Dorsey-Walker bringing her concerns to the Board, and Mr. Voelp stated that the Board will take the information under advisement.

DISCLOSURE OF CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS

There were no campaign disclosures.

SCHEDULE NEXT MEETING

The next meeting is scheduled for Thursday, May 27 at 2 p.m.

Mr. Hogan made a motion to convene in closed session under General Provisions Article, §3-305(b)(7), (8), (10), and (15), and Ms. Woodward seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously.

The motion having passed, the Board met in closed session in accordance with exemptions defined in (b)(7), (8), (10), and (15) of Section 3-305 of the Open Meetings Act to receive advice from counsel and consult with staff about pending or potential litigation and discuss public security, network architecture, and security of election network without introducing risk to the process.

The closed session began at 3:20 pm. Mr. Voelp, Mr. Hogan, Mr. Funn, Mr. Miller, and Ms. Woodward attended the closed meeting. In addition to the board members, Ms. Lamone, Ms. Charlson, Mr. Trento, Ms. Duncan, and Mr. Treichel attended the closed meeting.

Mr. Trento provided legal advice on potential or pending litigation, and Mr. Treichel answered questions concerning information security.

No action was taken.

Ms. Woodward made a motion to adjourn the closed meeting, and Mr. Hogan seconded the motion. The motion passed 4-0.

The closed meeting adjourned at 4:10 pm.

SBE Policy 2021-01: Extension of Temporary Electronic Petition Signature Acceptance

Adopted: January 12, 2021

Annapolis, Maryland

WHEREAS, on March 5, 2020, the Governor issued a proclamation declaring a State of Emergency in an effort to control and prevent the spread of COVID-19 within the State, and has renewed that proclamation at regular intervals;

WHEREAS, during this State of Emergency, the Governor and local authorities have imposed restrictions on certain business operations and public gatherings of persons as a result of COVID-19:

WHEREAS, the State Board of Elections recognizes that the current, extreme conditions inhibit the collection of signatures required for a petition to gain access to or place a question on the ballot;

WHEREAS, on April 22, 2020, the State Board of Elections, pursuant to its authority under Md. Code, Comm. Law § 21-117(a), authorized the use of electronic signatures to facilitate signature-gathering during this state of emergency;

WHEREAS, on June 12, 2020, the State Board of Elections, pursuant to its authority under Md. Code, Comm. Law § 21-117(a), authorized the extended use of electronic signatures to facilitate signature-gathering during this state of emergency;

WHEREAS, petition efforts for the formation of new political parties, for the nomination of unaffiliated candidates, and relating to a question arising under Article XI-A, Article XI-F, or Article XVI of the Maryland Constitution, or §9-205 of the Local Government Article may begin in collecting signatures for placement of a candidate or ballot question on the November 8, 2022 gubernatorial general election ballot;

WHEREAS, in light of the restraints imposed by State and county officials, the State Board of Elections believes that an extension of the acceptance of the electronic signature for filing a petition is appropriate;

WHEREAS, the State Board of Elections believes that allowing the submission of petitions bearing electronic signatures during this period will further the State's goals of minimizing the threat posed by COVID-19 while preserving the Constitutional rights of Marylanders to petition for access to or to place a candidate or question on the ballot;

THEREFORE, the State Board of Elections states as follows:

1. Findings.

- a. The State Board of Elections finds that extension of the acceptance of electronic signatures for a petition will not endanger the public health, welfare, or safety.
- b. To the contrary, the extension of the temporary acceptance of electronic signatures for petition promotes the public health, welfare, or safety by providing sponsors to collect signature with limited or no in-person interactions.

2. Policy.

a. The policy and requirements stated in SBE 2020-01 on April 22, 2020 remain the same.


3. Applicability.

a. This policy shall be in effect from January 13, 2021 until May 27, 2021 for submitting any petition with an electronic signature to place the name of an individual or question on the November 8, 2022 gubernatorial general election ballot, or to create a new political party in time for that party to qualify to nominate candidates to appear on the ballot at the November 8, 2022 gubernatorial general election.



Written Testimony to Maryland State Board of Elections

Subject: Accepting Electronic Signatures for Petitions

Board Meeting: May 27, 2021

Submitted Jointly by the Libertarian Party of Maryland and the Green Party of Maryland

Dear Chairman, Members of the Maryland State Board of Elections:

Introduction

Petitions may be submitted to achieve a number of purposes under Maryland election law, including placing the name of an individual or a question on the ballot, the creation of a new political party, and the appointment of a new charter board under XI-A §1A of the Maryland Constitution. Such petitions can apply either locally or statewide. Note that in this context the petitions being discussed do not apply to municipal petitions. We are focusing our testimony principally on the process of petitioning and petition submission for the purpose of forming a new political party, which often includes reestablishing recognized status when an existing political party fails to meet the requirements for maintaining recognized status and must petition as if a new political party.

During the covid-19 pandemic, emergency powers were exercised by the State of Maryland which dramatically limited social gatherings and this had a consequent impact on the 2020 elections. Like many, if not most other states, Maryland was required to adapt some of its election procedures and processes to accommodate these emergency restrictions, including the petitioning process and the standard by which political parties could be formed. Some of these changes were very popular among voters and we believe it is important for the Maryland State Board of Elections (hereinafter the "State Board") and the State of Maryland to learn productive lessons from the pandemic to improve outcomes for all of Maryland's eligible voters.

We will focus on one very minor change, which can nonetheless improve outcomes for Maryland voters and ease slightly the administrative burdens of local boards of elections. On April 22, 2020, the State Board adopted a policy allowing petition signatures to be affixed to petitions electronically, pursuant to its authority Md. Code Ann. Comm. Law §21-117(a). This was necessary to allow registered voters the opportunity to sign a petition placed on a website so that they could give voice to their support for the petition remotely, without the need to violate social distancing requirements. The State Board had (and continues to have) the authority to allow electronic signatures for petitions prior to the pandemic and it is consistent with its authority to: (1) prescribe the form and content of petitions; (2) specify procedures for the verifying and counting of signatures; and (3) provide any other procedural or technical requirements that the State Board considers appropriate through regulations, pursuant to Md. Code Ann. Elections §6-103(a).

We are recommending that the State Board amend its regulations to allow the use of electronic signatures for all future petitions, subject to any necessary procedural safeguards. We will first make our argument why this is the better outcome for Maryland voters, then describe

how electronic signatures were collected, validated and submitted during 2020, to better inform your decision.

Electronic Signatures on Petitions Improve the Purpose of Petitions

Electronic signatures result in a higher validation rate, which demonstrates that the traditional printed form for petitions that are signed during an interpersonal exchange are not fully representing the will of those Maryland registered voters whose signatures are not counted due to process errors. Electronic signatures better ensure that a Maryland registered voter is having their intention to support the petition recognized by the State Board. The requirement for third parties to petition is a barrier to entry to participation in the electoral process, and a higher validity rate lowers the burden of that barrier to entry. However, the purpose of petitioning is not to maintain a barrier to entry, but to establish that a minimum level of support by Maryland voters exists to support the proposition of the petition. Any procedural system which better achieves that purpose should be encouraged as more reflective of the will of those voters who elect to sign the petition.

There are two relevant signatures on a petition: the signature of the individual Maryland registered voter and the signature of the circulator of the petition, the latter being under affidavit. Each of these signatures is submitted with accompanying information mandated by the statute and the State Board's regulations.

The purpose of any petition is to demonstrate the will of the required number of individual Maryland registered voters who support the proposition that is the subject matter of the petition. For the formation of a political party, it is described on the State Board's petition form as: "We, the undersigned voters of Maryland, support the organization of a political party to be known as ______ Party," where the blank is the name of the political party, followed by identifying the name and address of the State Chairman of the party.

To sign the petition as an individual supporting the petition, the person must be a Maryland registered voter. Their signature can represent political support for the party, but it can and often does support merely the proposition that the voter supports that party being organized so that they or other Maryland voters are given another choice in political parties (including their nominated candidates). All Maryland registered voters are therefore given the personal right to sign such a petition and the processes and rules governing the petition process should be designed to facilitate that right, subject to rules necessary to validate the voter's identity and rules governing the process of petitioning, to ensure fairness and accuracy.

A Maryland registered voter may sign their name in any fashion they wish under Maryland law, and quite often individuals' signatures are as much an artistic 'scribble' than a cursive form that discloses the name being signed to an average reader. An electronic signature asks the voter to affix a signature that exactly matches their name in the registration database, which removes any ambiguity as to the validity of the voter when matching the signature with the printed name. The Maryland registered voter has the choice to make such a change to their signature and under the electronic signature system employed in 2020, they were allowed to do so.

In addition to their signature, a Maryland registered voter submits their first, middle and last name, their full Maryland residence address (street number, street name, apt. no., city or town and zip code), their date of birth, and the date that their signature is affixed to the petition. By notice on the petition form adopted by the State Board, the individual voter signing the petition is advised that the information they provide is public information and may be used to change their registration address.

The purpose of the personal information and the signature is to validate the voter by cross-referencing it with the registration database maintained by the State Board. As will be described below, because the information is automatically populated into the appropriate fields when a person is signing the petition electronically, the voter's information is very likely to match exactly the information for which it is being checked during the validation process. When Maryland registered voters fill out that information by printing it and then signing the petition, numerous opportunities for errors arise. The voter can simply be sloppy in thinking about their information, they can write in an illegible fashion as they fill out the form, they can write only a portion of their address, and they often do not want to provide a date of birth (especially as the incidents and public concerns about identity theft have increased and privacy of information is viewed as more important). Electronic signatures eliminate these errors, better reflecting the will of the voter who has chosen to support the proposition by signing the petition.

Because petitions can be posted on a website or other social media, making electronic signatures permanently accepted for petitioning allows those voters who have transportation or other difficulties getting to a location to have improved access to the petition. The State does not facilitate access of all Maryland registered voters to hear about the opportunity to sign the petition, but rather the sponsoring organization and their circulators must go to them. In traditional petitioning, paid or volunteer circulators go to various locations and ask strangers to sign the petition (if they meet the qualifications). Those circulators are therefore reaching a narrow subset of voters who are asked to sign the petition. With electronic signature petitioning, a wider subset of voters can be reached as the address and request to sign the petition can be more broadly shared via social media.

As long as a Maryland registered voter is 18 years of age or older, they can act as a 'self-circulator', whereby they sign the petition form not only in support of the proposition, but as the circulator by signing the circulator affidavit at the bottom of the form. The circulator is also required to provide their name, residence address, and telephone number, as well as their signature and the date of the signature. Under electronic signature systems, all this information can be populated accurately and the signature can be accepted just as any other written signature.

Because the electronic signature forms are printed using computer fonts, the information provided to the State Board in the petitions is very clear to the reader. This should dramatically lessen the burden on local boards of elections when validating the petitions. This should save both time and costs in processing the petitions, though you are in the best position to measure such potential savings.

In the modern age, it is antiquated to require printed and written signatures on a petition. The use of electronic signatures is a technological solution that more and more voters, especially

younger, are comfortable using to express their will in signing the petition. Electronic signatures offer an alternative, but need not completely replace traditional interpersonal outreach while petitioning. Some voters will prefer the traditional approach, others the electronic approach. The Board should facilitate those preferences because in maximizing voter options, the purpose of petitioning (expressing the will of a minimum number of Maryland registered voters), is more accurately demonstrated.

How the Electronic Signature System Works

In April of 2020, after the State Board of Elections passed Policy 2020-01 a system was developed to collect electronic signatures. This system was used by the Green Party, the Libertarian Party and several other petition campaigns.

This system allows people to use a web or mobile browser to provide the name and address information that exists on their voter record, populates that into a digital version of the paper petition form and then requires them to type their full name both as the signer and the petitioner.

Administrators for each petition have the ability to review each signature, and print them out one by one for submission to the Boards of Election.

The system we have been using has several safeguards in place in order to prevent duplicate petitions, a large amount of signatures coming from one IP address and a series of other anomalies.

The system seeks to make a direct match to the information in the voter file and If there is not a match the submission is rejected and the potential signer is notified that the signature could not be processed.

The process stores email (optional) and phone number (required as element of the petition circulators signature) and keeps those elements secured and separate from any voter registration information. The privacy notice on the site informs users that this information is optional and is only used to follow up regarding their submitted signature.

Configurations can be made to restrict the petitions that are accepted to a Geographic area or an election district. For example, if a candidate were seeking to run as an unaffiliated candidate for Baltimore City Council district 3, the collection system can be configured to check the voter file and only allow signatures from people registered in that council district.

From an administrative perspective this means that every petition submitted to the State Board matches the name and address of a voter in the voter database, that verification previously done by the state and local boards has already happened in order to collect the signature.

- Administrative error of any kind on the part of the Division.
- ☐ The lateness is due to extenuating circumstances, i.e. physical illness or death in the family.
- ☐ The late report is the first late report and allows the committee to close, or contains minimal financial activity.
- □ The fee will cause undue financial hardship, if the liability of the fine is the personal responsibility of the officers.
- Computer problems occurred which made timely filing impossible. However, the filer still must have demonstrated a good faith effort to timely file.

Prior to the meeting please review each waiver request. Note the recommendations that you may disagree with or have questions on that you would like to discuss.

Pursuant to Election Law Article §13-337 (b) (3), the State Administrator has denied seven waiver request, for the month of May. No Board action is required on the denials. Late fees collected year to date for Late Fee Waivers are \$97,321.00.

I am respectfully requesting that the late fees be waived for the filing of the 2021 Annual Report for this campaign committee.

I filed the affidavit for the campaign on January 19, 2021, as the campaign has neither raised nor spent \$1,000.00 or more during the past year. When filing this report, I simply clicked the "file affidavit" button on the first page, when it took me to the next page, I just clicked on the "file affidavit" button again, not realizing there was a button at the top of the page which had a drop down menu to specify which report was being filed. Apparently, when I did not click on that drop down button, the automatic default in the software filed for the year farthest in the future programed into the system. Thus, instead of filing the 2021 Annual Report, which I intended to do, the system filed an affidavit for the 2022 Annual Report. Without realizing what had happened, I logged out of the system and went about my business. I checked my email later that night and saw that I had an email from SBE stating that my affidavit filing had been received. I didn't read the email carefully, presuming the system had filed correctly for the next required deadline, (which would have been for the 2021 Annual Report) and not some future year leaving the current deadline blank.

The affidavit was filed with time to spare as it was filed before noon the day before the January 20th deadline. The email I received from the SBE is time stamped 11:45 a.m. January 19, 2021. Had I realized the system had jumped to a future year instead of filing for the current year, I would have corrected the error as there was still plenty of time before the deadline. Since I was only filing an affidavit, there would have been no need for additional time to compile the report. Therefore, I am requesting that the late fee be waived as the report was filed on time, but was attributed to the wrong year. In my opinion, this error was due to a flaw in the software for the filing system, which caused the filing to be credited to a future year as opposed to the year for which it was intended.

On behalf of the Libertarian Party of Maryland, I am requesting that you consider allowing, on a permanent basis, the use of electronic signatures for petitions filed with the State Board of Elections under Maryland law. The State Board of Elections has the authority to accept electronic signatures for such petitions pursuant to Md. Ann. Code Comm. Law §21-117(a). This is the same authority upon which the Board based its April 22, 2020 ruling that accepted the use of electronic signatures for petitions on a temporary basis in 2020. The acceptance of electronic signatures on a permanent basis will serve the public interest and the just and efficient administration of the election laws of the State of Maryland.

I ask that the Board consider placing this issue on your agenda at your next regular meeting (May 27, 2021), or at your next earliest convenience. Please note that your temporary extension of the acceptance of electronic signatures under SBE Policy 2021-01 (adopted January 12, 2021) is set to expire by its terms on May 27, 2021.

Once scheduled, I would like to submit a memorandum in support of the proposition, provide oral testimony in support, and answer questions the Board may have with respect to this issue. The Green Party of Maryland will likely join us in wanting to be heard on the matter.

Re: Proposed Regulations for May 27th Meeting

At the May 27 meeting, I will present proposed changes to existing regulations to implement Senate Bill 283 and House Bill 156 of the 2021 Legislative Session ("Student and Military Voter Empowerment Act"). This memo summarizes the requirements of the new law and the proposed changes, and the text of the proposed changes accompany this memo.

This new law requires that election officials accept on certain Federal Post Card Applications (FCPA)¹ an electronic signature applied by a Common Access Card². Under this new law, an electronically submitted FPCA with changes to an existing registration or a request from a registered voter for a mail-in ballot can be signed using a Common Access Card. An electronically submitted FPCA from an unregistered individual cannot be signed using a Common Access Card.

The proposed changes related to this implementation are:

- 1. 33.05.01.02 (Voter Registration) and 33.11.01.01 (Absentee Ballots): Adding definitions for "Common Access Card" and "Federal Post Card Application" and referencing the definitions in Election Law Article, §3-202.1. Adding these definitions requires the renumbering of subsequently defined terms.
- 2. 33.05.04.04 (Voter Registration): The proposed change to §B(3) reflects current practice. Online voter registration and other electronic transactions require digitized signatures from MVA. The proposed change to §B(5) incorporates the new requirement that a Common Access Card signature can be used to update an existing registration.
- 3. 33.11.02.05 (Absentee Ballots): The proposed changes incorporate the new requirement that a signature applied by a Common Access Card can be used to request a ballot (proposed §B(1)(b)) and correct a drafting error (proposed §B(1)(c)).

¹ The <u>Federal Post Card Application</u> is a form for military and overseas voters to register to vote, update an existing voter registration, and/or request an absentee ballot. The form is produced and distributed by the U.S. Department of Defense's Federal Voting Assistance Program.

² A Common Access Card is the identification card issued by the U.S. Department of Defense to active-duty military personnel, eligible reserve personnel, Department of Defense civilian employees, and eligible Department of Defense contractor personnel.
