Welcome to Lunch and Learn

- A service provided by the MD State Board of Elections (SBE) and the Division of Candidacy and Campaign Finance (CCF) to assist candidates, their advocates and the citizens of Maryland on how to operate as a public finance (PF) candidate.
 - Twice monthly program
 - Understand the rules of PF and how they differ from a traditional / regular candidate committee.
 - Understand the mechanics of reporting your transactions into MD Campaign Reporting Information System (CRIS).

Latest PF Information As of 9/12/25

- 71% of all Maryland residents have the potential to support a PF candidate for County office.
- 125 PF filed candidates since 2018, includes 3 for Governor.
- In 2018, we had 40 PF committees of which 23 qualified and 5 maxed out.
- In 2022, we had 39 PF committees of which 25 qualified and 7 maxed out.
- In 2024, we had 8 PF committees of which 4 qualified and 1 maxed out.
- There are 37 PF committees active for the 2026 election cycle.
 - 2 PF committees have already qualified. (Howard and Montgomery)
 - PF cmtes. by county: 19 in Montgomery; 9 in Howard; 6 in Baltimore Co; 2 in Prince George's; and 1 in Anne Arundel.

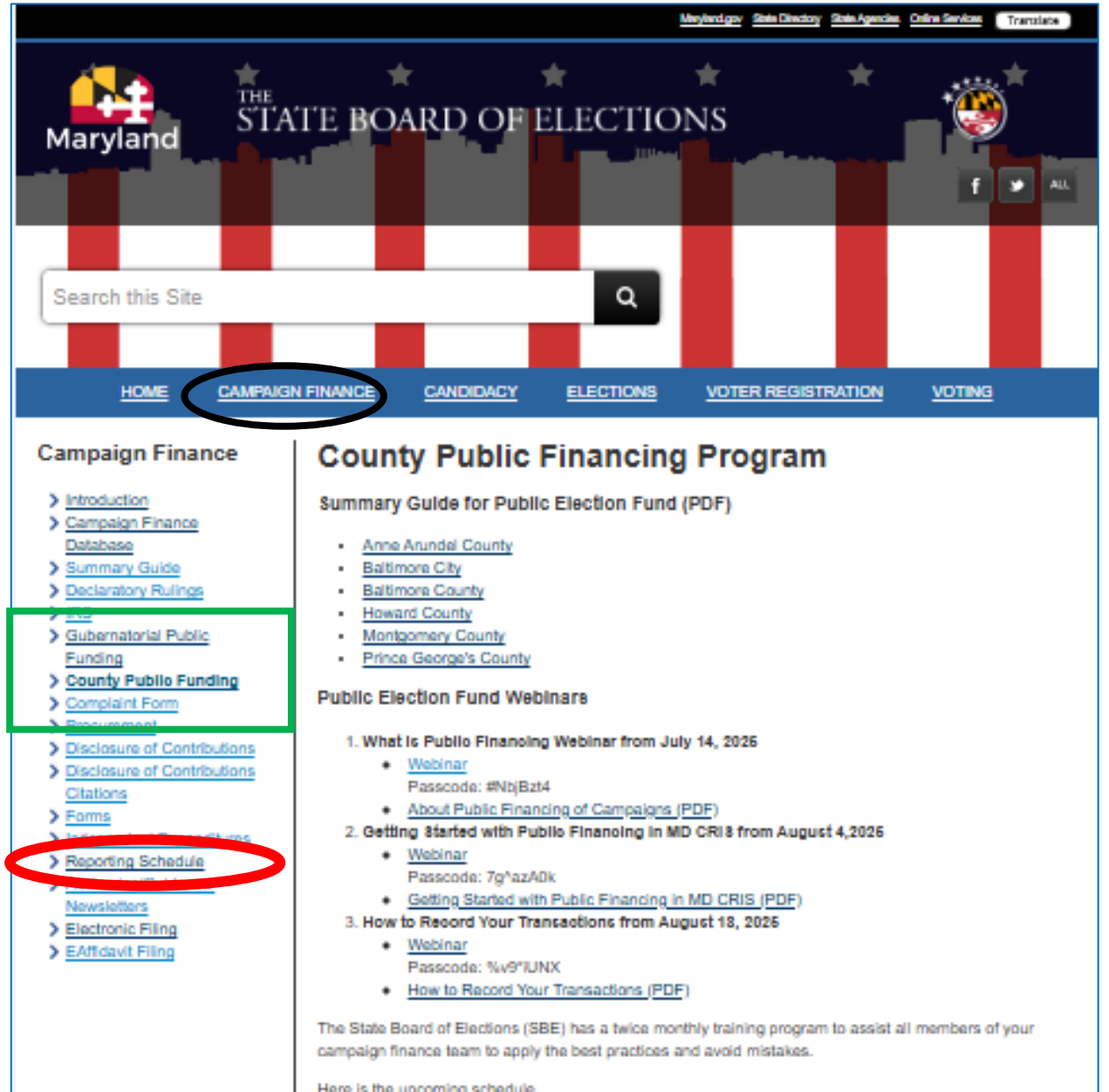
- Most of the counties have a proposed budget in FY2027 (Spring of 2026) to provide additional funding for the general election and beyond.

State Law Regarding Public Funding for County Offices

Summary of Public Campaign Financing Laws

ELECTION LAW
TITLE 13. CAMPAIGN FINANCE
SUBTITLE 5. LOCAL PROVISIONS

Md. Election Law Code Ann. § 13-505 (2017)

13-505. System of public campaign financing.

(a) County may establish system of public campaign financing for elective offices. --

(1) Subject to the provisions of this section, the governing body of a county may establish, by law, a system of public campaign financing for elective offices in the executive or legislative branches of county government.

(2) When establishing a system of public campaign financing for elective offices in the executive or legislative branches of county government, the governing body of a county shall specify the criteria that is to be used to determine whether an individual is eligible for public campaign financing.

(b) Requirements. -- A system of public campaign financing enacted under subsection (a) of this section:

(1) shall provide for participation of candidates in public campaign financing on a strictly voluntary basis;

(2) may not regulate candidates who choose not to participate in public campaign financing;

(3) shall prohibit the use of public campaign financing for any campaign except a campaign for county elective office;

(4) shall require a candidate who accepts public campaign financing to:

(i) establish a campaign finance entity solely for the campaign for county elective office; and

(ii) use funds from that campaign finance entity only for the campaign for county elective office;

(5) shall prohibit a candidate who accepts public campaign financing from transferring funds:

(i) to the campaign finance entity established to finance the campaign for county elective office from any other campaign finance entity established for the candidate; and

(ii) from the campaign finance entity established to finance the campaign for county elective office to any other campaign finance entity;

(6) shall provide for a public election fund for county elective offices that is administered by the chief financial officer of the county; and

(7) shall be subject to regulation and oversight by the State Board to ensure conformity with State law and policy to the extent practicable.

(c) More stringent regulation of campaign finance activity than provided by State law; administrative penalties. -- A system of public campaign financing enacted under subsection (a) of this section may:

(1) provide for more stringent regulation of campaign finance activity by candidates who choose to accept

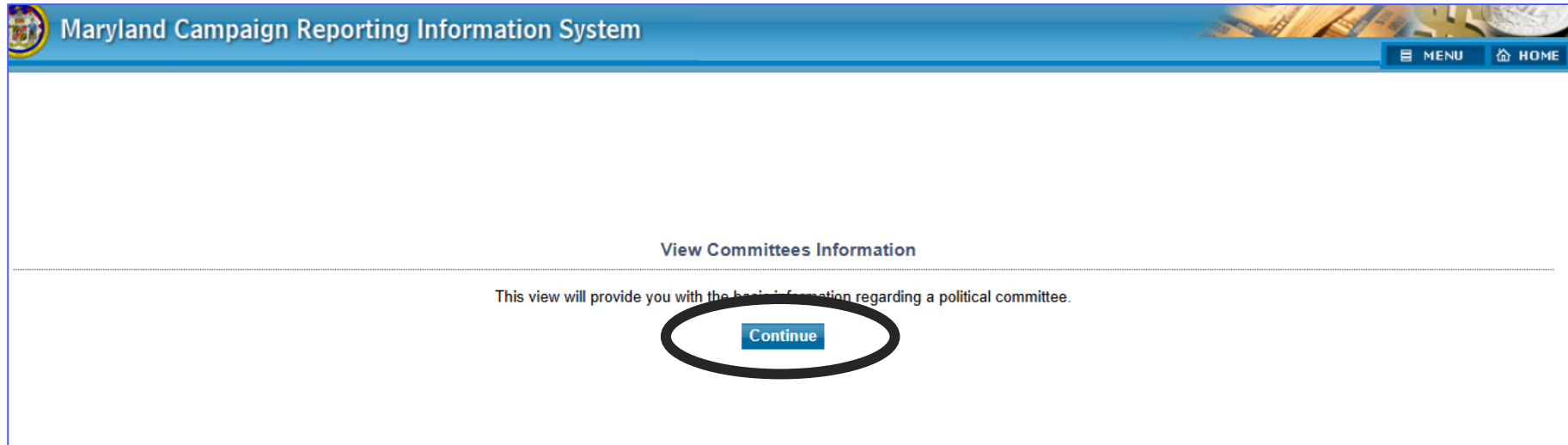

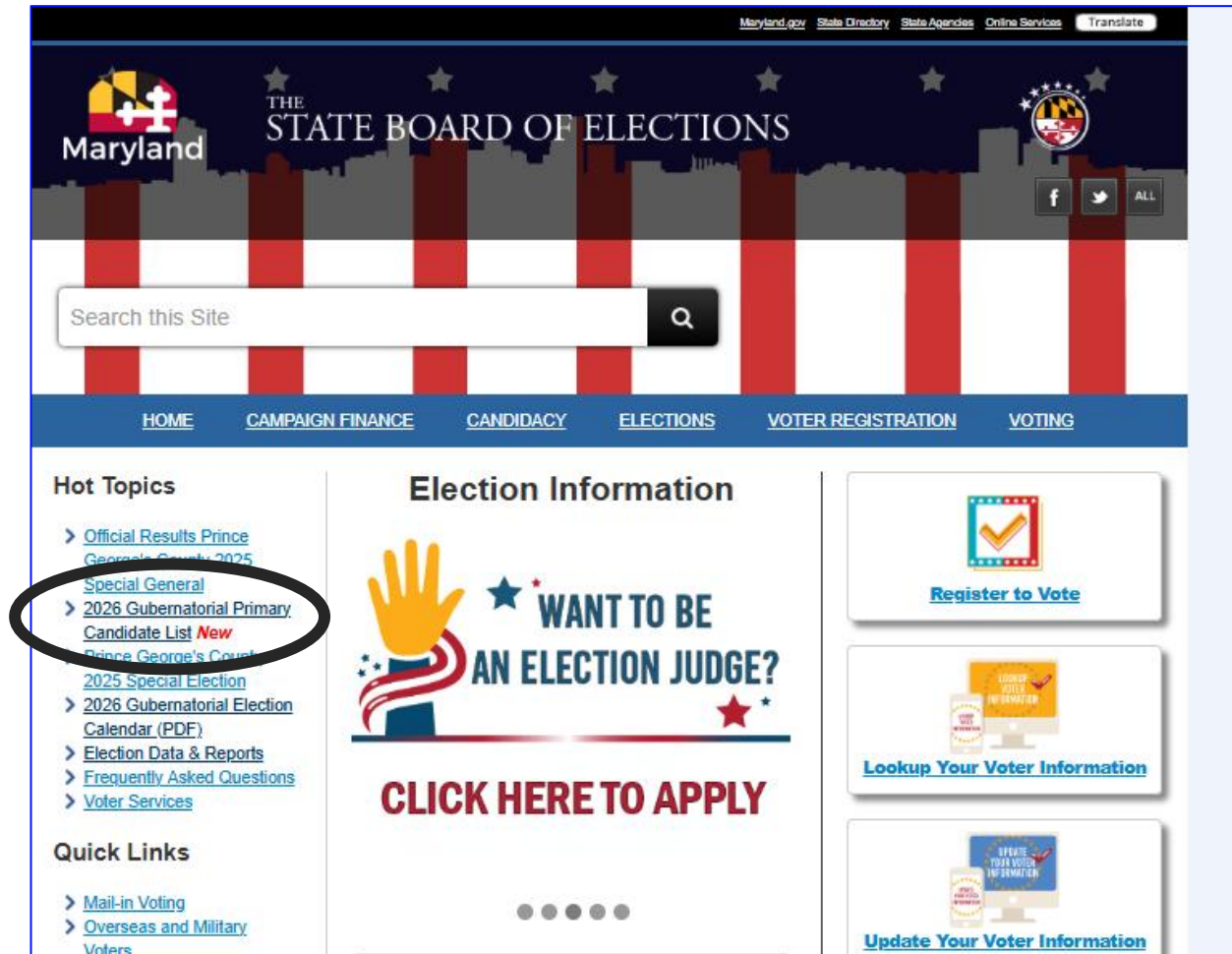

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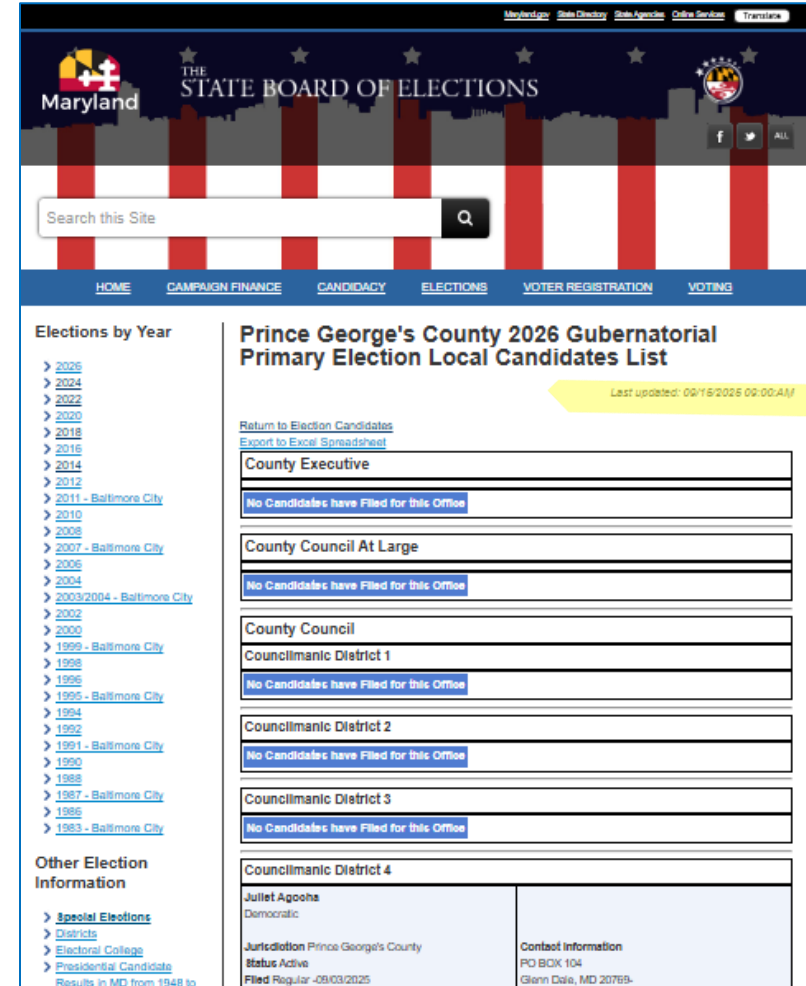

- Avoid obvious mistakes.

COLOR KEY: Meets Requirement Needs Improvement Misses Requirement	
1) Full name of the Candidate/ Campaign for the County Elective Office. Grade	
Description	Campaign/ Candidate name (usually as registered in MDCRIS).
Comments	Located on top portion of receipt (good and easily identified). I've seen through best practices a repeat of the campaign name in the statement of acknowledgment (especially when using digital signatures) to clarify the connection between the donation and knowledge that it will support the intended campaign.
2) Contributor's Name Grade	
Description	Name of the donor making the contribution.
Comments	Name is clear and matches signature.
3) Contributor's Residential Address in Montgomery County Grade	
Description	Residential address in Montgomery County (P.O. BOX is not allowed).
Comments	P.O. Boxes are not allowed to establish residency.
4) Contributor's Signature Grade	
Description	Matches contributor's name. Digital signature is not just signing the name, but it is an acknowledgment of both the donor's contribution to the publicly financed campaign and to understanding the laws with making contributions to publicly financed campaigns. Additionally, it must have a time stamp of the acknowledgement being made.
Comments	In best practices the statement of acknowledgement accomplishes most of the details through a positive 1st person perspective (donor's perspective). EXAMPLE: "My signature acknowledges that I..."
5) Amount of Contribution Grade	
Description	\$5- \$250 or (cash ≤\$100). See Summary guide for more specific information on contributions.
Comments	Amount is identified but it is unknown whether this is check, cash or credit card (credit cards will have transaction details annotated as well). Important details since cash contributions max out at \$100.
6) Date of Contribution Grade	
Description	Date when the transaction occurred. Additional Time Stamp is required when using digital signature method of signing.
Comments	Clearly reflects the date and time stamp requirement.
