Constitutional Amendment (Ch. 82 of the 2021 Legislative Session) Court of Appeals and Special Appeals -Renaming

Changes the names of Maryland's appellate courts from the Court of Appeals to the Supreme Court of Maryland and from the Court of Special Appeals to the Appellate Court of Maryland. 


