Step 1: Register to Vote

Eligibility

To register to vote, you must be:

- A U.S. citizen;
- A Maryland resident; and
- At least 16 years old*

You cannot register to vote if you:

- Have been convicted of buying or selling votes;
- Are under guardianship for mental disability and found by a court to be unable to communicate a desire to vote; or
- Are currently serving a court-ordered sentence of imprisonment for a felony conviction.

*You may register to vote if you are at least 16 years old. You can vote in a primary election if you will be 18 years old by the next general election. You must be 18 years old to vote in a general election.

Process

You can use Maryland's Online Voter Registration System (OLVR) to register to vote.

Or, you may complete a voter registration application in person at any time at an approved location.

Vote in Person

Vote in person before Election Day

Primary

You can vote early at an early voting center June 11 - June 18, 2026 from 7 am to 8 pm every day.

General

You can vote early at an early voting center October 22 - October 29, 2026 from 7 am to 8 pm every day.

Vote in person on Election Day

Primary

On June 23, 2026, vote at your polling place. On Election Day, polls are open from 7 a.m. until 8 p.m.

General

On November 3, 2026, vote at your polling place. On Election Day, polls are open from 7 a.m. until 8 p.m.

Vote by Mail

Primary

June 16th - Deadline to request a ballot delivered via mail or fax

June 19th - Deadline to request a ballot delivered via web delivery

June 23rd - Deadline to request mail-in ballot to be picked up in person at LBE

General

October 27th - Deadline to request a ballot delivered via mail or fax

October 30th - Deadline to request a ballot delivered via web delivery

November 3rd - Deadline to request mail-in ballot to be picked up in person at LBE

Step 3: Get Involved

Become an Election Judge

Your local board of elections is seeking dedicated individuals to ensure fair and accessible elections. No prior experience is needed, and comprehensive training will be provided. Serve your community—and earn money—by becoming an election judge.

Qualifications

To qualify as a Maryland election judge, you must meet the following minimum requirements by being:

- 16 years old or older (with parent/guardian permission).
- A registered voter in the State of Maryland.
- Able to speak, read, and write English.
- Physically and mentally able to work at least a 15-hour day.
- Willing to work outside your home precinct.
- Able to sit and/or stand for an extended period.
